

VFWT 2020 Impact

33 Wire Snares Removed

Wire snares were removed on from leopard, warthog, buffalo, elephant, waterbuck, kudu, bushbuck, impala and others

17 Anti-poaching personnel supported for five months

295 People Trained

253 Communal residents trained on improved livestock husbandry

42 Rangers trained in assessing wildlife diseases and crime scene techniques

400+ Offenders Arrested

Anti-poaching efforts have resulted in the arrest of more than 400 environmental and wildlife crime offenders

2350 Livelihoods

People directly benefitting from improved crop yields, human-wildlife conflict mitigation, and predator proof bomas.

1000+ Dogs Vaccinated

More than 1000 dogs were vaccinated against rabies and distemper in the rural areas around Victoria Falls

14 Black Rhino Calves protected

Each calf was immobilized, ear-notched with unique ID number, microchipped, and health assessed

304 Ranger Family Members Supported

Monthly food parcels were supplied to 71 wildlife rangers and staff, supporting 304 people per month over five months during COVID-19 outbreak

801 Livestock Protected

5 Predator-proof mobile kraals in 4 communities protected 801 heads of livestock from 68 villages, none of which were lost to predators

40 Villages Supported

20 Pilot plots and 20 control plots planted with maize and millet resulted in 30% increase in cropping yields per pilot plot

196 Lab Samples

Blood, tissue and hair samples were tested for diseases, analyzed to improve animal and ecosystem health, and logged for future wildlife forensic case work.
