In line with our mission of presenting innovative programming, The Guam Philharmonic Foundation will present the **2025 Tumon Bay Music Festival[™] (TBMF 2025)** from **Feb 26 - Mar 08**. TBMF is proud to celebrate its 20th anniversary of strengthening music, education, and camaraderie. This regional music event spans ten days with roughly 100 performances at several venues in nearly every genre. The festival, held annually, hosts between 800 - 1000 performers, their friends and families, partners from several schools in Guam and Saipan, as well as partners from our local business community. Our faculty and visiting performers have spanned the globe, including performers and faculty members from the U.S. Mainland and the Asia-Pacific region.

A portion of the proceeds of this year's TBMF will contribute to fundraising efforts to help the **Tumon Bay Youth Orchestra** (TBYO) and the **Tumon Bay Junior Band** (TBJB) represent Guam in Japan (Osaka-Nagoya-Gamagori) in August 2025, reigniting the Hands Across the Sea collaborative concert and musician friendship exchange. The Hands Across the Sea exchange began in 2013 and continued to be hosted back and forth between Guam and Japan until the COVID-19 pandemic. 

HISTORY OF THE FESTIVAL

The Tumon Bay Band Festival was founded in March 2005 by Mr. Maximo Ronquillo, Jr., the 8th Music Director of the Guam Territorial Band, the Official Band of Guam. With the assistance of local and stateside music professors, a three-day band festival was held and featured adjudicated performances by Guam's public, private, and military school bands. Harvest Christian Academy was honored as the Command Performance bands for both middle and high school divisions. The following year, the festival grew to a five-day event.

In 2007, the event was aptly renamed the Tumon Bay Music Festival™ due to the inclusion of a choral festival, handbell and choir festival, and performances by rock and jazz ensembles over a nine-day period. Mr. Randolph Stenson from St. Mary's School in Tokyo, Japan was invited to serve on the first choral and hand bell choir adjudication faculty. That same year, the Festival Sweepstakes Trophy was introduced. The award is given to the ensemble with the highest adjudicated score totals regardless of category. The first winning group was the choral group Magis.

In 2008, TBMF was elevated to a regional event when two school band programs from Saipan participated. In addition, Mr. Atsushi Ozawa conducted the first Festival Select Band. The 2008 Festival also included a piano performance by Sydney-based Mr. Evgeny Ukhanov, originally from the Ukraine. His performance of Maestro Ronquillo's band arrangement of Shostakovich's Piano Concerto No. 2 was the world premiere of any such arrangement. Also featured at the festival was Mr. Stenson's arrangement of "Tumon Bay", a piece written by the late Captain Peter Siguenza, Sr. (USMC-Ret.). The Saipan Southern High School Manta Band garnered the 2008 Sweepstakes Trophy.

Through the years a plethora of local and visiting artists joined the festival either as faculty or showcase performers. The sharing of their talents and eduational offerings have made the festival a truly beneficial event for the region.

At the close of 2022, the Guam Territorial Band turned over the festival to the Guam Philharmonic Foundation where Managing Director, Joanne Matanane and founder Max Ronquillo resumed operations. Tumon Bay Music Festival™ 2025 will include the Choral Festival, Band & Orchestra Festival, Jazz, Rock & Beyond: A Pop Concert, Solo & Small Ensemble Festival, and performances by the Tumon Bay International Wind Orchestra, Condcordia, Tumon Bay Festival Orchestra, and Guam Honor Bands.

FEATURED FACULTY

RANDY STENSON



Randy Stenson joined the Tokyo International Music School faculty after a distinguished 40-year career at St. Mary's International School, where he built a globally recognized vocal music program. His choirs have earned countless accolades on four continents at prestigious choral events, including several ACDA and Australian National Conferences. A graduate of Concordia College in Moorhead, MN, he studied under Paul Christiansen and Larry Fleming, earned an MME at VanderCook College of Music with Robert Sinclair, and has continued masterclasses with esteemed mentor Rodney Eichenberger. His ensembles have performed for royalty, heads of state, on television and radio broadcasts, and with renowned music professionals and ensembles. A sought-after clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor, Mr. Stenson edits choral series for Pavane and Santa Barbara Music Publishers and co-authored "Movement and the Maturing Male Voice" with Henry Leck.

Mr. Stenson is one of the first choral adjudicators for TBMF and has been a constant friend and supporter of the Festival for the last 20 years. He has worked with schools across the island, including the University of Guam during Dr. Randall Johnson's tenure as Professor of Music.

ATSUSHI YAMASHITA-OZAWA

Atsushi Yamashita-Ozawa studied percussion instruments under Mr. Makoto ARUGA, Mr. Kei-ichi Kitano, Mrs. Yukiko Nakatani, Mr. Guo-tian Hua, and Mr. Bo-Lun She. He studied orchestra conducting and ensemble under Mr. Yoshikazu Fukumura, Mr. Satoshi Sakakibara and Dr. Karl Jeitler, trombonist in the Wiener Philharmoniker, and professor at Universität für Musik und darstellende Kunst Wien. He went to China as an official dispatch foreign student, and learned conducting and percussion instruments at Shanghai Conservatory of Music and East China Normal University. He appeared in concert as a temporary percussionist in the Shanghai Symphony Orchestra, Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra, and Bangkok Symphony Orchestra. In addition, he served as assistant conductor (for Mr.Yoshikazu Fukumura) and a temporary timpanist in the Bangkok Symphony Orchestra. Since returning to Japan, he has appeared as conductor on numerous concerts of orchestras, wind orchestras and symphonic bands. Also, he's served as a judge at numerous music competitions. In 2004, he took part in production of a Japanese movie, "Blood and Bone" (directed by Yoichi Sai and presented by Takeshi Kitano) as music adviser and recording conductor. From 2006 to 2008, he was a guest conductor for the Silpakorn University Symphonic Band (Bangkok, Thailand) and guest lecturer of Silpakorn University Music Department. Additionally, he had lectured in Shih Chien University (Taipei, Taiwan), Tainan University (Tainan, Taiwan), Yamaha KHS Music (Taipei, Taiwan), Kasetsart University (Bangkok, Thailand), Siam Music Yamaha (Bangkok, Thailand), Yamaha Music Asia (Singapore), Yamaha Music Malaysia



(Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia), Yamaha Music Korea (Seoul, South Korea) and the others. He has been part of the Tumon Bay Music Festival as an adjudicator and conductor. He is the founding conductor of the Tumon Bay Music Festival International Wind Orchestra (TBIWO) where he commissioned and performed several new works for band since 2009. In the same year, he was given the Best Conductor Award by Kanagawa Prefecture Band Festival 2009, Japan. From 2010 to 2012, Mr. Yamashita has also gone on to be a guest conductor for the New York International Music Festival held at The Carnegie Hall (New York, USA), a guest adjudicator at the Korea Brass Contest at Chuncheong (South Korea) and a guest lecturer at the 4th Korea Wind Ensemble Clinic in Daejeon (South Korea). From 2013 to 2015, He was in charge of the Official Dispatch Educational Artist of the Agency for Cultural Affairs of Japan. He conducted the Aoyama Gakuin University Wind Orchestra (Tokyo, Japan) as a principal conductor in 2016- 2018. And He has been part of the Korea National Brasswind Contest (Kimhae, South Korea) as a guest adjudicator and competition adviser in 2018 and 2019. The JBC Band Method (English version) (published by Yamaha Music Entertainment Holdings, Inc.) he edited was released all over the world in 2019. And He won the Conductor Awards of the Japan Wind Orchestra and Ensemble Competition in 2012, 2018 and 2019. In July 2022, he was in charge of guest judge and lecturer at the WAMSB2022 (World Association of Marching and Show Band) Festival and Competition in Bangkok, Thailand. At that time, he was also in charge of conductor of the ASEAN Youth Wind Orchestra.
