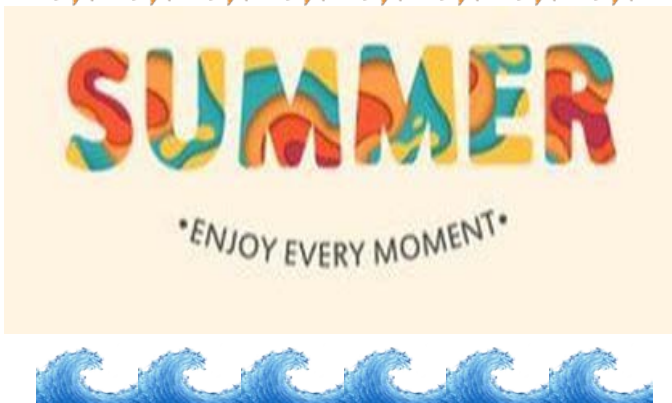


Brethren, welcome back!

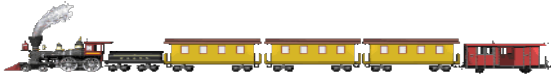

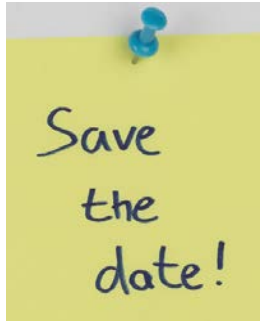

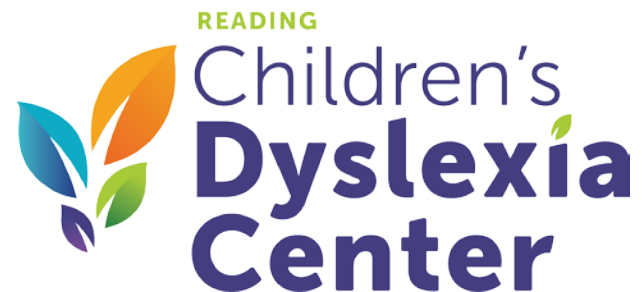
