General Information

The safety of our participating youth is our top priority. We only stay in name brand hotels in good neighborhoods. We make sure that each youth stays with the group. We rely on nationally recognized transportation that has a history of safety and customer satisfaction. We eat at well established, and national/regional chain restaurants. We provide honorable and trustworthy chaperons to help each youth feel comfortable, welcomed, and safe.

Chaperons

Most chaperones are recently returned sister missionaries who bring a contagious passion for the gospel to the tour. They are living proof that living the gospel can bring so much happiness into our lives. They are anxious to share their testimonies, knowledge of the gospel, and their righteous examples with those who join the tour. Our chaperons will be announced 5-6 months prior to departure. Our chaperons will not be compensated by Living Heritage Tours. Each chaperon will volunteer their time for the tour simply because they have a desire to serve the youth. However, Living Heritage Tours will pay for the lodging, meals, airfare, and ground transportation for each of our chaperons.

Chaperons will have many responsibilities and expectations. Each chaperon will be responsible for the youth assigned to them. This includes staying with the group, encouraging each youth to participate in the tour activities, caring for each youth's individual needs as those needs arise, and keeping a careful watch over each youth to make sure they are having a great time. Perhaps the greatest responsibility of each chaperon is to ensure that everyone has a memorable and spiritually uplifting experience.

Transportation

We hire deluxe charter busses and professional drivers. The bus is most comparable to an airplane in which the seats are leather, air conditioning works very well, there are overhead storage compartments, a sound system, a restroom, and monitors for movies.

We have never lost anyone, and we intend to never do so! We do frequent head counts at each site we visit, and the bus never leaves until everyone is accounted for.

Hotels and Restaurants

The hotels we stay at are national brand hotels situated in desirable areas of major towns or cities. Each hotel has been specifically chosen for our group. All the hotels offer a hot complimentary breakfast and swimming pool. We stay at Holiday Inn, Fairfield Inn, and Comfort Suite brand hotels. A list of our hotels, with contact information, will be provided two months prior to departure.

We understand that having a great time and socializing during the trip is important. Once we arrive at the hotel each night, it is required that no one leaves the hotel property but being together in the lobby area, swimming pool, or other public areas is encouraged. Plan on strong friendships being developed on this tour which will last a lifetime. We will have a curfew and it is expected that everyone will be in their own room by that time. Two chaperons will come around to each room just after curfew. Beyond making sure that everyone is accounted for, the chaperons will take this time to visit with the youth and ensure that they are having an uplifting, spiritual, and enjoyable time. This is an additional time when the youth can ask questions, or express concerns to the chaperons.

Anyone found outside their room after curfew or found in the room of someone of the opposite gender will be immediately dismissed from the tour. Returning home early will be at the arrangement and expense of the parents.

Each hotel room has two queen-sized beds. Rollaway beds are not available. Some have elected to pay the quad occupancy rate and pack a hiker's sleeping bag which is small enough and light enough to fit within a suitcase. If you plan to bring a sleeping bag, which is optional, it needs to fit inside your single suitcase.

What to bring

We will be standing in holy places each day where the spirit can be felt. The *For the Strength of Youth* pamphlet states, "When you are well groomed and modestly dressed, you invite the companionship of the Spirit". Below is a general list of items to bring. Please include more or less of what you know you will actually need. Opportunities to wash clothes will be very limited, if available at all. As you start to prepare for the trip, please be courteous to others and plan to bring just one suitcase and one personal carryon item.

Suggested packing list:

- 1 suitcase
- Backpack
- Enough clothing to last the whole trip:
 - Shirts
 - Pants/shorts
 - Pajamas
 - Underclothing/socks
 - Comfortable walking shoes
 - 1 set of Sunday clothes
 - Jacket/sweatshirt
 - Swimsuit (optional)
- Camera, or cellphone for camera use
- Photo ID for the airport
- \$50 or so for incidentals
- Souvenir money
- Reusable water bottle (this is a MUST)
- Scriptures
- Journal and pen will be provided
- Toiletries
 - Toothbrush/toothpaste
 - Brush/Comb
 - Sunscreen
 - Bug spray (you'll be glad for it!)
 - Deodorant
 - First-aid kit
 - Medications
 - Hand sanitizer

Bringing a cell phone is left to the discretion of your parents. If you bring a cell phone, it is your responsibility to not let it distract you from having a spiritual experience, learning, or interacting as a real person with others on the tour.

Airfare:

We have secured group space on flights so the group can travel together from Salt Lake City. The cost of the airfare is included in the total cost of the tour.

Cancellation Policy

We understand that sometimes things don't always go as planned and there may be a need to cancel your reservation. We want to help as much as possible by refunding as much as possible to you if you need to cancel. However, because the hotels, food, and transportation are prepaid, the following refund schedule will be followed:

You will be provided with a journal which is loaded with information and also plenty of space to record your own thoughts, impressions, and feelings you have at each historical site we visit.

You may want to think of these two questions as you write in your journal at each site we visit:

1. How will my understanding of the historical lessons I just learned about help me draw closer to the Savior in my everyday life?
2. How will the feelings I felt at this historical site help me in my personal life?

While traveling on the bus and at the sites, you will hear the history, personal accounts, and the stories of the events surrounding the restoration of the gospel of Jesus Christ. By the time we return home, you will have heard the history of the Church from 1805 to 1846...while standing in the actual places the events took place!

While this is a history tour, this tour should not be confused with school. We are going mix so much fun into our learning that it is expected that each person will return home having made many new close friends with which they will want to stay in touch with for a very long time!
