Mission Update: A Living Partnership in Brasilia

We continue to give thanks for our growing relationship with Bishop Mauricio Andrade and the vibrant work of the Anglican Diocese of Brasília. Through regular communication, we are witnessing a powerful expression of faith in action—one that is changing lives every day.

This season, the diocese of Brasilia celebrates an important milestone: the Anglican Social Centre has marked its 11th anniversary. What began as a vision for community care has become a vital ministry of presence, stability, and hope.



Today, the Centre serves approximately 130 children. Each child receives academic tutoring, computer training, and nutritious, balanced meals. Just as importantly, the Centre provides a safe and secure environment where children are known, valued, and cared for by dedicated staff who deeply impact their lives.

This ministry is not only meeting immediate needs—it is shaping futures. It is a reminder that the Church's mission extends far beyond our walls, connecting us across borders in shared work for the dignity, opportunity, and love of people of all ages.

We are grateful to be in partnership with this ministry and look forward to continuing to support and learn from the work unfolding in Brasília.

Global Episcopal Mission Network Conference - Missio 2026

Rev. Allan Wallace attended the GEMN Conference, held April 14–17 at the Church of St. Gregory of Nyssa. This year's theme, "Rooted in Christ & Dancing God's Dream," invited participants into a time of reflection, learning, and renewed commitment to God's mission in the world.

The gathering offered space for connection, inspiration, and deepening faith alongside others engaged in global mission and ministry.

Participants learned about the inspiring work taking place around the world as dioceses and churches build meaningful partnerships—like those the Diocese of Indianapolis shares with Haiti and the Anglican Diocese of Brasília. These connections are powerful reminders of how God's mission is lived out across cultures and communities.

The immersion includes daily worship in Spanish

The Spanish Institute of the Anglican Church of Mexico is a respected learning institution for those seeking to develop Spanish language skills while deepening their understanding of Mexican culture. Located in a secure and comfortable setting in an exclusive neighborhood of Cuernavaca—just 15 minutes from the city's historic downtown—the institute provides an ideal environment for study and community.

Cuernavaca, the capital of the state of Morelos, is often called the "City of Eternal Spring" for its year-round temperate climate. Situated less than two hours from Mexico City, it is known for its beauty, culture, and architecture, drawing visitors from around the world.

IDIAM is dedicated to offering high-quality Spanish instruction tailored to each student's needs. With a specialized teaching staff, the program focuses on four essential components of language learning: writing, reading, comprehension, and—most importantly—speaking with confidence.

We look forward to sharing updates and reflections from participants in the coming weeks as they engage in this meaningful experience.

In collaboration with the Episcopal Diocese of Susquehanna, we are excited to send our first group to the Instituto de Español de la Iglesia Anglicana de México for a two-week immersive experience. Participants will learn and practice Spanish while exploring the rich cultural heritage of Mexico. Six participants from the Diocese of Indianapolis will be participating.

A total of 13 participants from church communities across Pennsylvania, Indiana, and Kentucky will take part in this shared adventure of learning, faith, and connection.

Haiti Update

Difficult Climate/Holy People



For more than fifteen years, the Diocese of Indianapolis has partnered with the community of Mithon in Haiti, supporting projects such as the construction of the school, a well, and agricultural initiatives, and continuing to fund teachers’ salaries.

Today, the Mithon School serves 150 students with 10 teachers. Despite ongoing insecurity, it remains open Monday through Friday, offering quality education and daily meals.

The school seeks continued support for teachers’ salaries, student meals, and books. These resources are vital in a rural community where many families cannot reliably provide food, tuition, or supplies. Meals, in particular, ensure students can learn and thrive.

At the same time, efforts are underway to rebuild the Church of Mithon, which was destroyed in the 2010 earthquake.

During our visit to the school in Mithon, each class welcomed us with songs of joy and gratitude—a beautiful expression of hospitality we will not forget.
