Lenten Hope

Lent sometimes gets a bad rap. And I get it. There is enough darkness out there in the world, enough brokenness, that a somber Lent is not always something we're jazzed about. The penitential season of Lent can sometimes feel like the thing we have to suffer through to get to the Easter celebration we're really longing for. And self-reflection? Who has the time or the stomach for that?

But what if I told you that, at its core, Lent is all about life? Actually the word "Lent" itself comes from an Old English word for spring, the time when life breaks through the barrenness of winter. And in the life of the Church, Lent has long been a time of preparation for the new life of baptism. Historically, Lent is the time of preparing for new life in Christ. Lent is for preparing the ground of our hearts—doing the weeding, pruning, and clearing necessary to make way for the abundant life of God to flower and to grow. The whole season, and especially Ash Wednesday, calls us to dwell in the truth that everything we depend on apart from God will be insufficient to defeat the darkness and the brokenness. But there is one who can: Jesus, the resurrected Lord who promises to bring us with him through death to new life.



Lent is all about living into that new life in hope. As surely as the daffodils have pushed up again this spring, we will be raised to the new life of God. And Lent calls us to prepare for that life now. With disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we reorient ourselves away from the things that cannot save us, and back to the God who does. Lent is an exercise of hope in the resurrection. So as pandemic impacts drag on, as we watch the heartbreaking news out of Ukraine, we are bold to believe that this is not the life God intends for the world, and God will not let brokenness have the last word. The last word belongs to God, and it is life.

In that sure hope, I invite you to prepare the soil of your heart for the new life of God this Lent. We'll gather on Wednesday nights at 6:30 this year to sing, pray, and work on that soil. Small groups will gather to read scripture and pray for one another each week. Together we'll work to turn our lives toward that resurrection hope that has not faded across the generations.

The Ihsas Family St. Mark's Circle of Welcome

“for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me”

Matthew 25 : 35-36

St. Mark's has welcomed the Ihsas family. The Ihsas family arrived in Asheville on February 2, a tired and hungry family of ten. They became our family. By the time we loaded them into three vehicles plus a truck to carry their belongings it was dark. They still had a 45 -minute drive to their new temporary home in Montreat. They were fearful of what they would find in a new place, knowing little English, knowing no one, and not knowing where they would get food nor sleep. They thought we had dropped them off in a forest, far away from people, and according to the caseworker surrounded by bears.



Let me stop here and give you a little background of our family. The Ihsas family was brought here by the Lutheran Services of the Carolinas. The family includes the father, the mother, and 8 children ages 3-16; 6 boys and 2 girls.

They had lived in a major city in Afghanistan. The father was a journalist and a broadcast reporter. He worked with our special forces. Then one day, their whole life was turned upside-down. Abdul was told to bring his immediate family to the base with few belongings. The next day, their home was bombed by the Taliban. They were placed on a plane to Qatar, then sent from there to Italy, and then to Ft. Dix in New Jersey. Six months later, they arrive in Asheville, North Carolina. Within a week after arriving here, the grandfather dies in Afghanistan and the family finds out that the Taliban are still searching for them even though they are in America.

The oldest son is the only one who speaks English. He had been learning English in school in Afghanistan. He has been continuing his study of English with his teacher in Afghanistan, by studying with him over the phone from around midnight till 2 in the morning. He then helps his family to learn English during the day as well as translating their needs to us. He is an amazing young man.

Hopefully, through the generosity of members of this church, along with families, neighbors, and friends of this church, we are helping to relieve some of their fears and trauma. You have all been unbelievable in helping our family with donations of time, transportation, food, money, gift cards, bikes, clothes, toys, books, home needs, etc. However, **we are just at the beginning of our journey.** They will continue to need our support as they start classes in English, purchasing necessities of daily life, the children going to school, getting a living wage job for the father, transporting the family, and finding a place to call home.

Please keep the Ihsas in your prayers and those helping them to become citizens of America.

Visiting with Connie Koiner

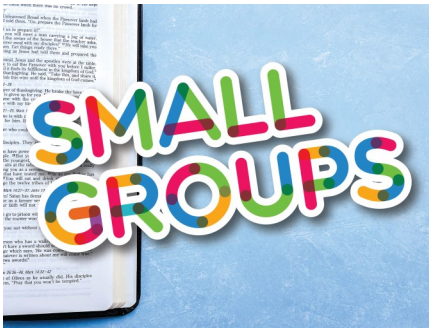

Greetings from the St Mark's Congregation Council!

Here are some highlights from our February 2022 Zoom meeting:

- We are still awaiting final inspections before opening the CW Avery Learning Center.
- We will resume singing hymns and the liturgy on Transfiguration Sunday, Feb. 27.
- Deacon Katie is working on the curriculum for the small groups, starting in March. Please sign up!
- The National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis this summer has been cancelled, so the youth are considering other activities to do that week. They will help to support the youth in the Afghan family.
- The Council voted to allocate the approximately \$40,000 2021 surplus as follows:
 - \$15,000 to Lutheran Services of Carolinas Be the Light Campaign
 - \$15,000 for St. Mark's debt reduction
 - \$10,000 for a scholarship fund for Living Waters Lutheran Church in Cherokee.
- The 2021 Annual Report has been prepared.
- There will be a special Council meeting on Feb. 28 to begin a discussion of planning for the 2023 St. Mark's Centennial celebration.

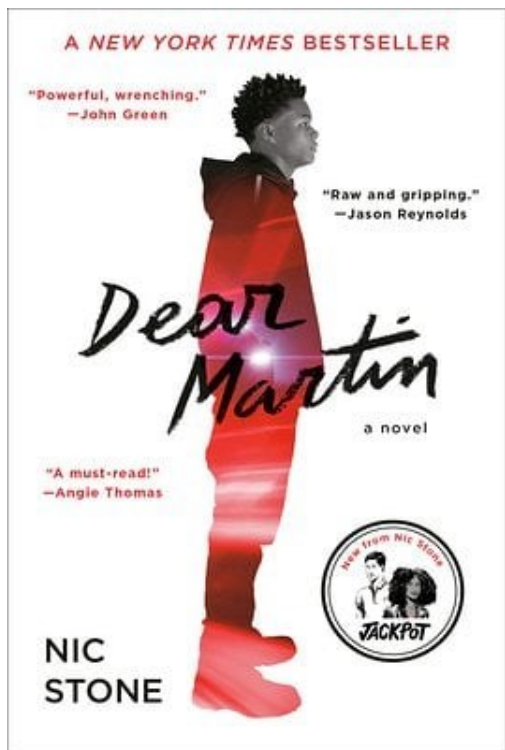
7 Clans Brewing is coming to Asheville

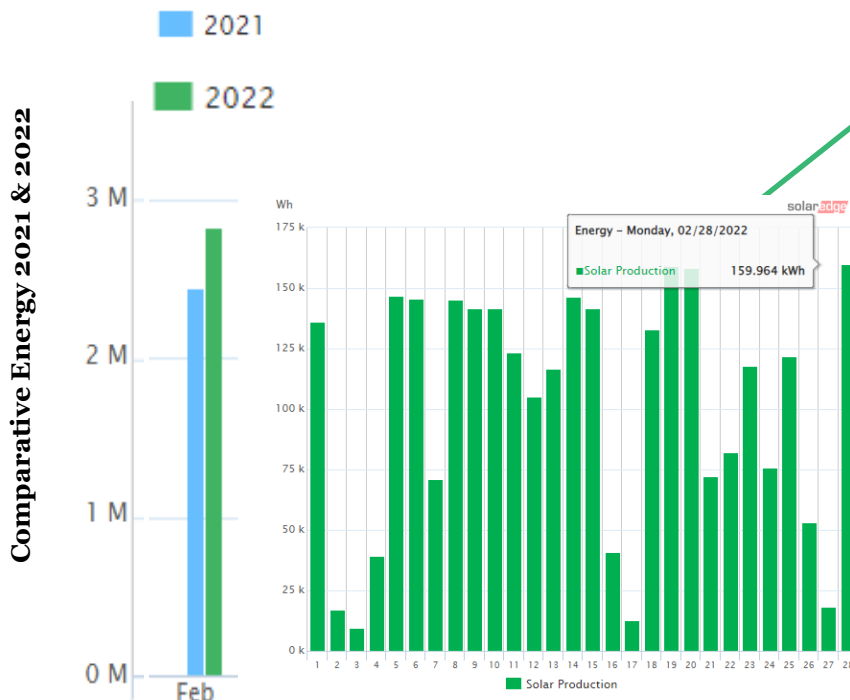
