A Pastoral Letter from your Clergy

In light of the recent Supreme Court ruling overturning Roe vs. Wade, abortion has come up in pastoral conversations with St. Mark's members. Some are rejoicing, others are weeping and gnashing their teeth. Some have expressed a clear desire for their congregation and their clergy to say something about all of this. What we (Deacon Katie and Pastor Matt) can say is that our heads are still spinning as we process, both personally and through the experiences of people we care about.



The ELCA's social statement on abortion from over 30 years ago continues to be the guide and basis for teaching in the congregations of this Church. The social statement says that the number of induced abortions is a source of deep concern for a Church that values life made in the image of God, while also recognizing that abortion is morally complex and ought to be legal. The

social statement also explicitly acknowledges that Christians acting in good faith come to different conclusions on this issue. Conversations in faith formation in this congregation have grappled with the complex task of interpreting how the nuances of the biblical witness might inform us. None of this is easy.

I (Pastor Matt) will share a personal story with you. In the Spring of 2015, Keri and I had decided to start a family, and she was thirteen weeks pregnant. All indications to this point had been positive, and we were so excited (and a little bit nervous) that we were becoming parents. We don't know why, but this potential life never made it. As many as half of fertilizations end in miscarriage, often before the woman even knows she is pregnant. Our experience was not unusual then, but it was devastating.

In addition to the emotional trauma, the physical toll was overwhelming. For 36 hours Keri bled and contracted in intense pain before her OB told us we needed to the hospital for a D&C. I'd never heard that term. It's what the procedure is called to remove tissue from the uterus. In many cases it's synonymous with abortion. For us, this procedure was what we needed to stop Keri's body from physically shaking and hurting so that we could slowly begin healing from the shock and trauma of this loss.

I share all of this to say that I resonate with the ELCA's teaching. We never wanted an abortion, but in this situation this procedure was clearly what we needed to heal and be well. I fear that in places where abortion becomes illegal in almost all circumstances, women may lose access to the care they need to heal and be well.

At different times in my life, I (Deacon Katie) have been surrounded by people on the extreme sides of this issue. I've held the hands of friends in clinics; I've protected people from protestors as they crossed lines to receive reproductive health care; I've been invited to and attended a Right to Life Rally; I've attended the Women's March. With that diverse background on this issue, what I'm feeling most called to is to remind those who are baptized of the covenant that God made with them at the font.

It is my call as your Deacon to equip and encourage you to live out your baptismal calling in the world, which includes promises to "work for justice and peace in all the world, and to proclaim the word of God through word and deed." So, yes, God calls you to work for change, to protect the vulnerable, and to fight for justice so that we might see peace this side of heaven. Please, do that good and Godly work. God also calls you to proclaim the word of God in what you say and do, and that word of God is love. So in your interactions with others, put on love and understanding for your neighbor. It's the only way to ensure the doors of communication stay open so that needed conversation can happen.

We (Deacon Katie and Pastor Matt again) recognize that there is no one size fits all solution to reproductive decisions. Each situation is complex. What we can confidently say is that no matter what your lived experience with abortion has been- if you've had an abortion or you haven't- you are beloved of God. And there's nothing in this world or beyond it that can change God's love for you.

We love you too, and if there are ways we can help you process the world we live in until Jesus comes in glory, we're here. Please reach out if it's helpful to have a conversation companion in your journey of the life of faith.



Here are some highlights from our June 2022 Zoom meeting:

- The Treasurer's report continues to show a positive balance for the year to date.

CHS serves students from all six districts of Buncombe County and Asheville City Schools with approximately 110 students (but can serve up to 150). The school contends with disproportionately high rates of truancy, chronic misbehavior and delinquency, homelessness, food insecurity, emotional and psychological difficulties, teenage pregnancy and parenthood, familial disruption, drug dependency, trauma, learning disabilities, and other issues. The staff at CHS supports these kids by targeting both their academic AND existential needs. But they cannot do this with only the funding provided by the state and district.



So that's where St. Mark's can step in! We invite you to come and enjoy an ice cream sundae in the heat of July while staff from the school explains the amazing work they do at Community High School (and just wait until you hear ALL they do), and what steps we can take to support them with the funds raised. 1st Monday of the month @ 6:30pm






