Our Diocese is blessed with many unique programs for all ages. One such program is our Blue Ridge Service Corps, a program of intentional community of prayer and action in Western North Carolina. We invite young adults, ages 20-26, who wish to serve their greater community, to join us for a year of service at a placement in our diocese. Past placements have included the Calvary Food Pantry, Center for Spiritual Wisdom, Habitat for Humanity, and Church of the Advocate, among others.

We just completed our second year of the program, and on Friday, May 20th, said goodbye to our four incredible 2021-2022 corps members: Flora, Eris, Matthew, and Evan. All four have served the community faithfully through their placements but also through community engagement and continued learning. It was a blessing to be with these four young people last Friday and send them on into their next stage of life, with the love and support of the Diocese of WNC behind them.
