HAITI EARTHQUAKE EMERGENCY

A deadly 7.2 magnitude earthquake violently struck the southern peninsula of Haiti on August 14, destroying homes and entire communities.

Over a thousand people have died, and the death toll continues to rise. Rescue efforts to save thousands of injured and missing people are happening nonstop, even as tropical storm Grace brings heavy winds and rains to the island.

“It is a matter of death or life for so many people now in the streets, we need some emergency relief,” said Bishop Oge Beauvoir, executive director of Food For The Poor-Haiti.

Our partners and staff in Haiti are doing everything they can to help the victims of the earthquake by providing critical and lifesaving supplies, and they are counting on YOUR donations.

We encourage you to drop off a food bag of nonperishable items from the list below at our headquarters in Coconut Creek, Florida (please make sure the food has an expiration date no earlier than 02/2022). We urge the inclusion of pop-top canned goods.

- Canned evaporated milk
- Canned sweet corn
- Canned green beans
- Bags of yellow corn meal
- Bags of rice
- Canned Vienna sausages
- Canned sardines
- Canned tuna and chicken
- Canned fruit (peaches/pears)
- Canned red kidney beans
- Soups
- Protein bars
- Gatorade
- Jugs of cooking oil
- Packs of Ensure or PediaSure
- Feminine hygiene products
- Baby food and cereal (expiration date of 02/2022 or later)
- Soap (bar or liquid)
- First aid kits
- Rubber boots and gloves
- Paper towels and toilet paper

Additional essential items you may wish to include:

- Baby items: diapers, wipes, blankets, gently used clothes
