Voter Checklist Things To Do Before Election Day

- **Confirm you are registered to vote several weeks before Election Day.**
- **Provide correct information if your address, name, phone number has changed.**
- **Know the voter requirements early.**
- **Know your polling place and how to get there.**
- **Know what time the polls open and close.**
- **Become acquainted with the candidates and issues on the ballot.**
- **Consider becoming a poll volunteer on election day.**

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Am I Eligible To Vote?

Voting is a right granted to every Ugandan. You are eligible to vote if:

- You are a current UNAA member in good standing-Articles 6.11 and 7.3 of the UNAA Constitution.
- You meet residency requirements.
- You are 18 years old or will be 18 before the general election.

2. How Do I Register To Vote?

Through paying your membership dues as a UNAA member in good standing.

3. Where is the Polling station?

Polling station will be in Chicago at the annual general assembly.

4. How does voting take place?

The UNAA voting method is user-friendly, even to eligible voters with limited computer knowledge. Inside the polling station, on a computer station voters select from a list of candidates. They check the ballot box next to the candidate of choice.

5. How are UNAA voters identified?

Voters must be identified by one of the following identification:
A government issued photo ID

6. What are the basic principles of UNAA's election process?

General: Every duly registered UNAA member 18 years or older has the right to vote.

Direct: The Executive, Council and Regional Representatives are elected directly by the UNAA voters at the General Assembly. On Election Day, voters cast one ballot for a single each individual to represent them.

Equal: All votes cast are equal in weight.

Secret: Elections are by secret ballot.
