



World Peace Village comes to Trinity Episcopal Church and School

The Episcopal Diocese of Texas owns a museum-quality exhibit that is an experiential teaching tool about the main religious traditions of the world, and how each one prays for peace. Participants touch and use the sacred objects of each tradition: Christianity, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, and Native American Spirituality. We learn the Golden Rule of each tradition, and the Greeting of Peace.

This large exhibit will fill the entire upstairs of Eaton Hall, and includes a center section of tables upon which we have the chance to make a craft representing each tradition: things like prayer beads or flags or a prayer mat. An adult or older kid can go through the Peace Village in a “self-guided” way, and younger children will need supervision.

We will set up on October 13th, and the exhibit will remain set up until October 27th. More details are coming as we will schedule Sunday School, our own school classes, outside groups to visit, and the entire community one afternoon as well. After October 27th, the World Peace Village becomes the property of the Trinity Episcopal School and there will be many other opportunities to use each of the materials.
