Letter from the Pastor

Dear Members of Saint Clement,

Being a part of our dynamic parish is like watching God unfold miracles amongst us. God is present to us, and it is God's faithfulness and love that we experience during challenging times. I am both honored and privileged to partake in what God is doing, in and through our church. Without question, every parish is a unique work of the Holy Spirit, but I am truly grateful to be part of Saint Clement, and thankful that you are too.

There are many graces illustrated within the pages of our annual Stewardship Report. This report demonstrates God's movement among us, and provides examples of how our five anchors articulate who we are. We also share important parish statistics and a financial summary of the past fiscal year. As you read through the report, I hope you find it to be life-giving, faith-building and God-exalting.

Some things have changed since our church building closed in March, due to COVID-19, but our purpose at Saint Clement remains the same. As a parish community, we exist to know, love, and share the gift of Jesus Christ with others. We do this through our dedicated ministries, our outreach and service opportunities, and the commitments we share.

I am humbled by your active engagement and financial support of Saint Clement, and through us, of our larger Church. As COVID-19 impacted our personal lives, it also affected our parish. Over the past two years, we have lost around 200 families as parish members, accounting for an approximate income deficit of \$200,000 annually. While concerning, I have faith that these losses will motivate us to draw on new energy, to rededicate ourselves to our mission, and to provide committed and purposeful support to flourish. The same God that called our parish into existence in 1905, is present among us, and will continue to bless the work before us.

Please join me in a prayer of thanksgiving for all that we were able to accomplish over the last year, for the hard work that resulted in Saint Clement School receiving the distinguished 2020 Blue Ribbon Award, and to thank God for Fr. Rex and his ministry among us. I believe the year ahead, though it may continue to be different, will be blessed by God and I cannot wait to see what God will do in our midst.

Coming Together to Celebrate Our Parish Anchors


Saint Clement's Virtual Community Weekend, *Anchored Together*, took place Friday, June 12th through Sunday, June 14th. The cancellation of the 29th Anchor Ball coupled with the COVID-19 quarantine, prompted the idea of a virtual community event that would connect and engage all of our parishioners. *Anchored Together* was an opportunity for parish members to come together through our five anchors in support of each other, and in support of Saint Clement. The online event allowed for flexibility to join from wherever you were located, and whenever you desired.

Centered on the five anchors, the weekend included prayers, countless community service opportunities, including a no-contact food drive (see top two images), recognition of the graduating 8th grade class, viewing of the 2020 Anchor Ball Paddle Raise Video, Saint Clement history and trivia contests, the sale of Bonanno Wine with a portion of sales donated back to Saint Clement, the sale of Saint Clement masks, the sale and display of Anchor Notes, and a Paddle Raise. Numerous other offerings were available on the event website, allowing participants to pray, serve, give, learn, and belong at their leisure.

Despite the quick planning, *Anchored Together* was a successful, first-ever, virtual community event at Saint Clement. We **raised a total of \$15,573** over the weekend, and of that amount, \$14,528 was generously donated in the Paddle Raise. Saint Clement mask sales and Anchor Notes collectively raised \$1,045. In turn, Saint Clement donated 10% of the Paddle Raise proceeds to St. Leo Campus for Veterans.

Thank you to all who planned and participated in the *Anchored Together* weekend. We are grateful for your support.



In prayer we purposefully seek to be in relationship with God, our loving creator, who has gifted our lives in many ways. As Christian stewards, we respond in thanksgiving by deliberately giving back to God the gift of our time, so as to foster our relationship with God as an individual and as a community.

Praying Together Virtually

When the COVID-19 pandemic shut down much of the world, including our city, we moved our opportunities to the virtual world. Our Masses and prayer opportunities — such as praying the rosary and small faith groups — moved online so we could continue to pray together, though apart. We also created and shared prayer resources, including resources for families.

- Our first livestream Mass was March 22, 2020.
- We celebrated 32 online Masses through June 30, 2020 (fiscal year end).

Clement Community Helps Clear Over 30 lbs of Garbage from Oak Street Beach

Headed up by our **Creation Care Ministry**, on September 21st parishioners participated in the 2019 International Coastal Cleanup, clearing away much trash, including:

- 482 cigarette butts
- 153 foam pieces
- 98 pieces of glass
- 188 pieces of plastic

One way Saint Clement Parish answered this call to service during the COVID-19 shutdown was through the **Virtual Ministry of Care**, created as a way to check in on elderly, homebound, and isolated members of our community. **Over 300 parishioner families were reached out to via phone, email, and card by 60 volunteers from early April - early May.**

We also created our How to Help guide for additional ways to serve the most vulnerable members of our community during this time.

Serving During the Shutdown

During the COVID-19 shelter-in-place order and the restrictions it placed on our access to parish buildings, we had to temporarily suspend our Friday Sack Lunch and Hospitality Program. However, our commitment to those facing homelessness and food insecurity remained a fundamental part of our faith and identity at Saint Clement.

We continued to live out this commitment by working with the Chicago Help Initiative (CHI), to host a mobile food truck at Saint Clement Parish, providing prepared meals to-go for all those who depend upon Saint Clement for weekly food and fellowship.

We Give of Our First Fruits:

Clement Commits

Total distributed: \$195,000!

Since 2003, Saint Clement Parish has been deepening its understanding of being a stewardship parish. The practical spirituality of stewardship is based in the scriptures. Spiritually, this means that each person in the parish is encouraged to spend time understanding how all that they “have” is a gift from God and that each person is uniquely gifted. This leads to the next step of prayerfully deciding how those many gifts will be given back to God. This giving back is sacrificial because individually our time, talent, and treasure are limited resources. Practically, it means that as a parish we make a commitment to give of our “first fruits” to needs beyond our parish. We honor this commitment through *Clement Commits*, which donates 10% each fiscal year from our parish collections.

The *Clement Commits* program was originally designed to eliminate most second collections at Mass and to make a financial commitment as a parish to put our faith into action in the service of our community members in need. The program began in 2003, when Saint Clement donated 7% of parish collections. This percentage increased each year until we reached our target of a full tithe of 10% in 2014.

Structure of program:

Of the 10% of parish collections from each fiscal year:

- 70% is allocated as grants to organizations that complete the *Clement Commits* grant application process.
- 30% is allocated to funds and causes supported by Archdiocesan second collections.

Total amount donated through Clement Commits for FY 2020: \$195,000

- Amount given in direct grants: \$136,500
- Amount given to Archdiocesan Second Collections: \$58,500

Direct Grants:

In order to receive a grant through the *Clement Commits* program, organizations submit funding applications for review by the *Clement Commits* Committee. Organizations that received grants the prior year also submit a report detailing the use and impact of those funds.

Archdiocesan Second Collections:

Since 2003, the percentage of funds to Archdiocesan second collections through *Clement Commits* has been based upon parish giving to each collection prior to the start of *Clement Commits*. These percentages are under review for the coming fiscal year/the next *Clement Commits* cycle.



*La Coquille ("The Shell") is an organization based in Ketou, Benin dedicated to serving children in need, particularly children who have lost one or both parents. **Clement Commits** funds were used last year to finance scholarships for school tuition and fees, compensate teachers for civic engagement programming, and provide school supply kits for children in the La Coquille program.*



New Recipients in Fiscal Year 2020

- **The Night Ministry:** The Night Ministry is a Chicago-based organization whose mission is to provide housing, health care, and human connection to any and all community members struggling with poverty or homelessness. Funds from *Clement Commits* will assist in the organization's transition to its new location in Bucktown, which will serve as the new home to The Crib youth shelter, the Outreach and Health Ministry Program, and central administration.
- **Mercy Home for Boys & Girls:** Serving kids in Chicago since 1887, Mercy Home's mission is to save young lives by providing a safe, nurturing residential treatment home, AfterCare support for former residents and their families, community-based, site-based, and workplace-based youth mentoring; promoting therapeutic, educational, vocational, spiritual and life skill development; and raising public awareness of youth in need. Funds from *Clement Commits* will assist Mercy Home in meeting the basic needs of those they serve through an emergency fund set up at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.



Parroquia Inmaculada Concepción (Immaculate Conception Parish): *Clement Commits* funds assisted our sister parish in replacing the old church floors with new ceramic tiles (see antes/ahora (before/after) photo) and in remodeling the parish restrooms. The funds also contributed to the remodeling of the new Saint Óscar Arnulfo Romero Pastoral Center.

Financial Statement Footnotes:

- (1) Collections are shown net of the 10% donated off the top through *Clement Commits*. See previous two pages for details on *Clement Commits*.
- (2) Other Income includes rental income, interest income and miscellaneous income.
- (3) The Salary & Benefits line items include salaries/benefits for all full-time and part-time staff: clergy, educational, administrative, music/liturgy, ministry, maintenance, etc.
- (4) Property Operations for the parish campus includes Utilities, Maintenance & Property/Casualty Insurance.
- (5) Ministry, Outreach & Hospitality includes all ministry costs, including the Child & Family Catechesis (a/k/a Religious Ed) Department.
- (6) Correction on FY19 School Income & Expenses.

(7) Each year Saint Clement parishioners generously support the neediest parishes and schools as well as the work of Catholic Relief Services by donating to the **Annual Catholic Appeal**. Last year Saint Clement donated \$252,292 to ACA.
