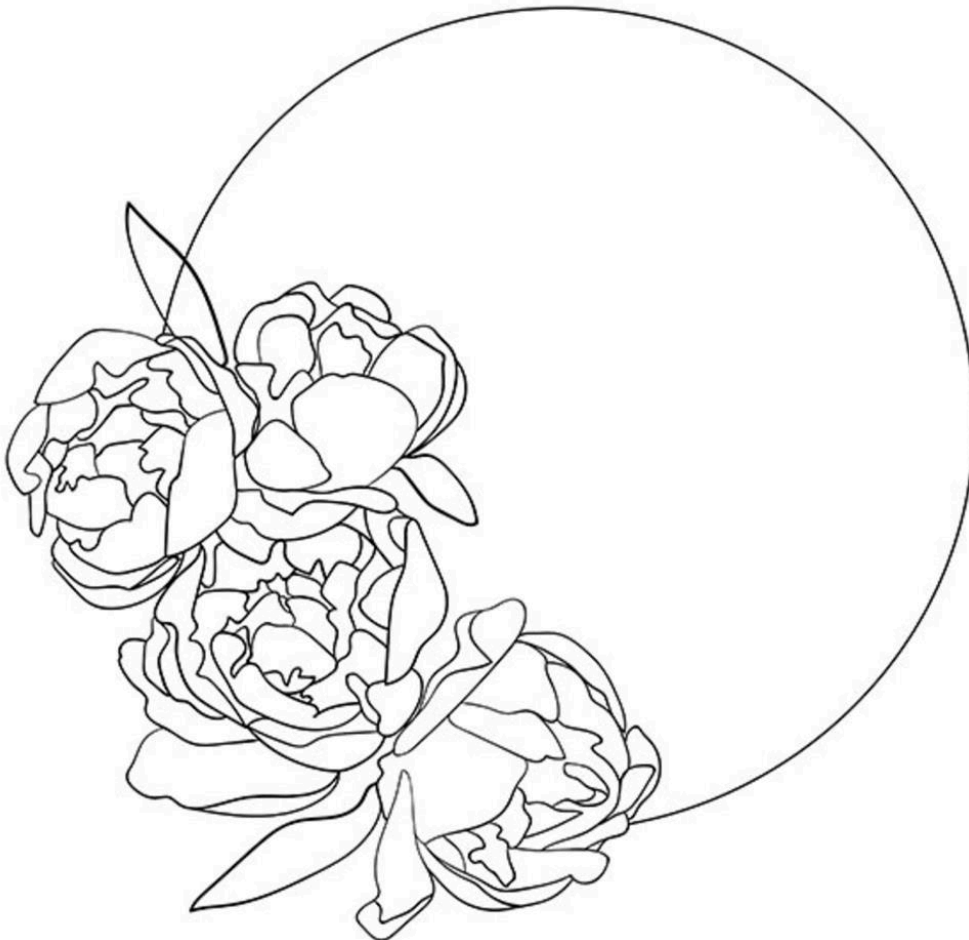

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The First Lesson: Judges 4:1-7

Reader A reading from the Book of Judges.

The Israelites again did what was evil in the sight of the Lord, after Ehud died. So the Lord sold them into the hand of King Jabin of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor; the commander of his army was Sisera, who lived in Harosheth-ha-goiim. Then the Israelites cried out to the Lord for help; for he had nine hundred chariots of iron, and had oppressed the Israelites cruelly twenty years.

At that time Deborah, a prophetess, wife of Lappidoth, was judging Israel. She used to sit under the palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim; and the Israelites came up to her for judgment. She sent and summoned Barak son of Abinoam from Kedesh in Naphtali, and said to him, “The Lord, the God of Israel, commands you, ‘Go, take position at Mount Tabor, bringing ten thousand from the tribe of Naphtali and the tribe of Zebulun. I will draw out Sisera, the general of Jabin’s army, to meet you by the Wadi Kishon with his chariots and his troops; and I will give him into your hand.’”

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

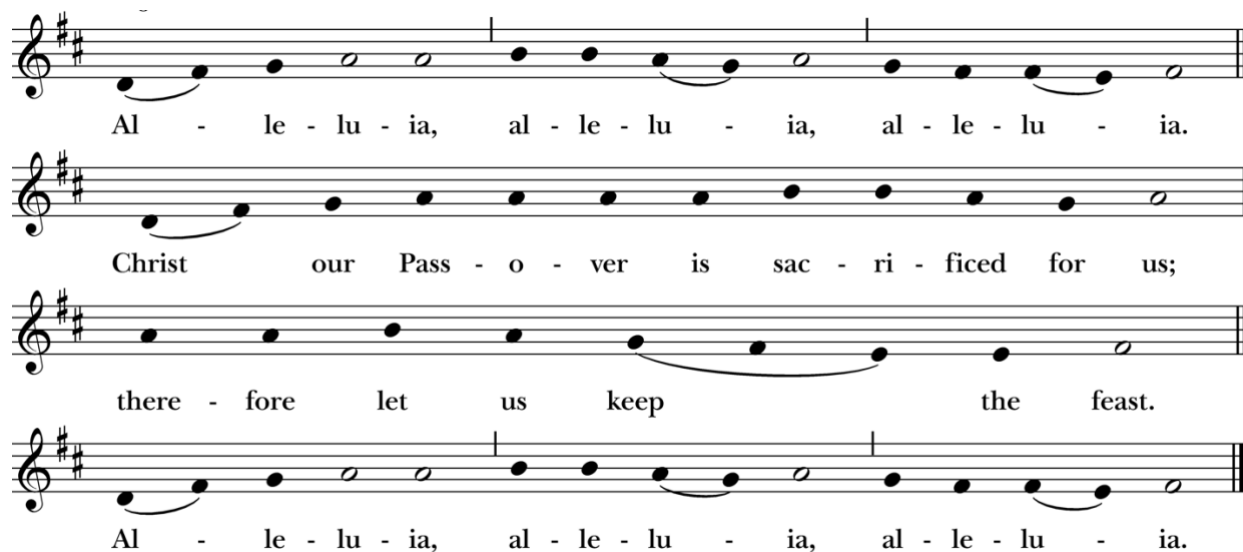

- **About Today's Music** The prelude is an organ arrangement based on the German sacred solo Dank sei dir, Herr, (Thanks be to Thee). Traditionally attributed to George Frideric Handel (1685-1759), modern scholars believe the text and tune were composed by Siegfried Ochs (1858-1929) since no scores can be traced prior to the late 19th century. * Leo Sowerby (1895-1968) was organist and choirmaster at St. James Episcopal Cathedral in Chicago for over thirty years. Upon his retirement, he was called to Washington National Cathedral to become founding director of the College of Church Musicians. His anthem *I will lift up mine eyes* is based on Psalm 121. * The text of the communion anthem was written by French poet and dramatist Jean Racine (1639-1699) and set to music by composer Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924). Composed by Fauré at the age of nineteen, Cantique de Jean Racine won first prize at the school of church music École Niedermeyer de Paris. The accompaniment is lead by a simple, lyric melody with flowing triplets as the underlying chordal structure. The choral parts begin with the bass line and leading upward to the soprano line to give the anthem the most glorious yet refined elegance. * The postlude is based on today's recessional hymn. Baroque composer and organist Georg Friedrich Kauffmann (1679-1735) was chosen as a finalist for the position of Kapellmeister in Leipzig but ultimately was awarded to J.S. Bach.
