Lee School District: Latest on Hurricane Ian damaged schools

It's been nearly four months since Hurricane Ian barreled through Lee County, damaging three schools to the point students are still unable to return.

Across the district, 35% of maintenance service requests related to damages from the hurricane have been completed.

Here is the most recent updates on Fort Myers Beach Elementary, Hector A Cafferata Jr. Elementary and The Sanibel School provided by the Lee County School District:

Fort Myers Beach Elementary

- The district is having a town hall on Jan. 13 to discuss options for the future of the beach school.
- There will be a presentation on those options and a decision made in February.
- The district is currently remediating and stabilizing the historic building. That work is expected to be complete at the end of January.
- A waiver for the 50% rule has been requested from the State Historic Preservation Office. The 50% rule is a regulation made by the National Flood

Insurance Program that prohibits improvements or repairs to a structure exceeding 50% of its market value.

Hector A. Cafferata Jr. Elementary School

- The temporary portable campus for the elementary school at Cape Coral Technical College has been completed. Students returned on Dec. 19.
- Long-term plans for the school are still being finalized.
- A presentation on the options for the school will be given on Jan. 24.

- The remediation of the school is complete.
- The replacement of the HVAC and electrical equipment is currently underway and should be complete at the and of January.
- The district will schedule the reopening of the school once all safety criteria are met.
