This sacred journey offers space for renewal and a deepened sense of purpose in carrying the mission of Mercy forward.

How to Apply

Applications are due March 17, 2026. [Submit yours here](#). You will be asked to upload a letter of recommendation from an administrator or colleague at your school. This letter should share how you embody the *Profile of a Mercy Pilgrim* (see page 4 for details).

Selected participants will be notified in April.

For Faculty and Staff: Your head of school's support is required to complete your application.

Mercy Education is thrilled to support participants on this immersive pilgrimage to Ireland. Expenses covered include:

- Travel from your local airport to Dublin Airport
- 5 nights at the Mespil Hotel, just a short walk from Mercy International Centre
- Meals, travel, and fees for all scheduled pilgrimage activities

Dates: August 17-22, 2026

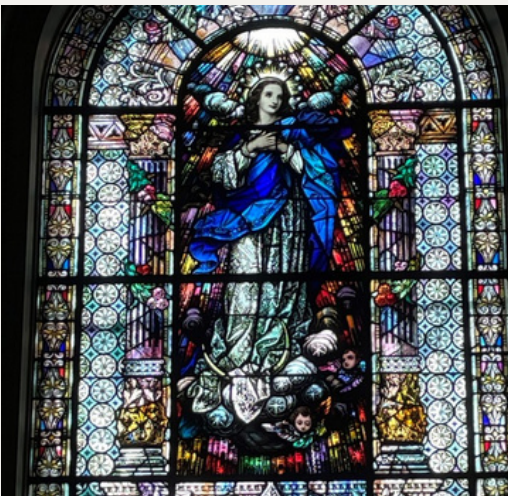
- Virtual pre-trip meeting: July 23, 2026
- Virtual post-trip meeting: September 30, 2026

Participants are welcome to arrange additional travel before or after the pilgrimage at their own expense.

Air Travel: Schools are responsible for purchasing airline tickets, and Mercy Education will reimburse the cost after the pilgrimage. Please note that travel expenses cannot be reimbursed if the participant is unable to attend.

Passports: Applicants must hold a valid passport and be able to travel internationally in August 2026. Passport validity requirements vary by country; please confirm the guidelines that apply to you. Travelers using a U.S. passport should ensure it is valid for at least six months beyond their planned return date.

Interpretation: Spanish interpretation will be available.



PROGRAM DETAILS

Participant Expectations

This pilgrimage is an opportunity to grow personally and professionally. Participants are expected to:

- Engage fully in all programming and events, including pre- and post-trip meetings.
- Reflect on and incorporate pilgrimage learnings into lesson plans and/or co-curricular activities in ways that advance the mission of Mercy within your school community.
- Share their journey and insights with their school community through a presentation to faculty and staff.

School Responsibilities

To support participants, schools are asked to:

- Provide teacher coverage, if needed, while the participant is on pilgrimage
- Allow time at a faculty/staff meeting for the participant to share their experiences and insights from the journey

PROFILE OF A MERCY PILGRIM

A Mercy Pilgrim is one who feels a call to deepen their connection to Catherine McAuley's life and story and to share the fruits of that experience within our Mercy schools. Grounded in the tradition of Mercy education and committed to exploring the Mercy mission and charism, each pilgrim approaches this journey with an open heart, a reflective spirit, and a readiness to learn and grow.

Our pilgrims come from across Mercy Education ...

heads of school, administrators, teachers, and staff—each actively engaged in Mercy life and ministry. Pilgrims should have at least four years of service in a Mercy school and be committed to continuing their service in the 2026-2027 academic year.

Grounded in mission ...

A Mercy Pilgrim embodies the Mercy Education Core Values and the Critical Concerns of the Sisters of Mercy, drawing inspiration from them both personally and professionally. They demonstrate a genuine affinity for the mission of Mercy and actively seek to integrate it into their life and work. They have participated in spiritual formation experiences—such as retreats, service projects, or mission-based initiatives within their school. Leading by example, they serve as mentors and role models, nurturing the Mercy spirit among students and colleagues.

After the pilgrimage ...

Mercy Pilgrims return with renewed energy for the Mercy mission and a commitment to share their experience. They thoughtfully integrate what they have learned into classroom and co-curricular life, finding creative ways to deepen the Mercy charism within their school community. Each pilgrim also shares their insights with colleagues, fostering reflection and growth among faculty and staff.

At heart, a Mercy Pilgrim is curious and compassionate ...

eager to learn from the history, culture, and people who shaped Catherine's world. They approach the pilgrimage with humility and gratitude, recognizing it as both a gift and a responsibility to carry the Mercy story forward.

This experience welcomes those already immersed in Mercy life as well as those seeking to grow more deeply in it. All pilgrims share a desire to strengthen Mercy identity within their communities and ensure that Catherine's legacy continues to shine.
