About Laundry Love of Greater Danbury (LLGD)

LLGD helps people who are struggling financially to clean their clothes and linens on a regular basis by providing them free, pre-paid laundry cards and detergent. We see the laundromat as a place where strangers become friends, people are known by name, and the worth of every human being is acknowledged and celebrated.

As a chapter of the national non-profit, Laundry Love, LLGD aims to brighten the lives of people through love, dignity, and detergent by partnering with community groups and a local laundromat.

Fiscal Year Highlights

Thanks to the generosity of donors, LLGD was able to fulfill its mission:

- In our ongoing response to the health dangers of the pandemic, we continued to distribute pre-paid cards with detergent directly to guests through community partnerships, rather than offering in-person, monthly laundry events.
- We increased our number of community partnerships from three to eleven, including Pacific House, Catholic Charities, Danbury Farmers' Market, St. Peter Church, Salvation Army, Dorothy Day, WIC, Danbury Young Lives, Walnut Hill Community Church, Jericho Partnership and White Street Wash.
- In June 2021, we provided about 145 loads of laundry, surpassing the number of loads provided pre-pandemic at in-person laundry events.
- Despite decreased in-person attendance at most of our founding faith organizations due to the pandemic, all of the organizations maintained their financial support.
- Per the best practices of National Laundry Love, we have successfully met the goal of acquiring 12 months of operating expenses at the start of each fiscal year for the past 2 years.
