His name is Christopher, and he is expected to die soon. My short encounter with this beautiful, yet devastated family was a gift from God himself. I believe that anytime one is moved by the Holy Spirit to act or to do something, regardless of how difficult or sad it was predestined by God, it was the will of God. Each of us are called to walk with one another on this difficult journey, even if only for a short while. On this day I had the opportunity to walk with many men, some women and one special child, and it was a day I shall never forget. I would even venture to say I learned a new way to pray this day... I learned how to pray for a miracle, I learned how to pray with a stranger, and I learned how to pray with my brothers and sisters.

When I left the conference later that evening, I was physically exhausted, for it was a very long day. And although I was tired, I had a beautiful joy and love in my heart that is very hard to explain and reduce to words. The Men's Conference allowed me to see the face of God and the faces of my children and family. It allowed me time to count the blessings in my life and time to thank God for my vocation as a Deacon. It was truly a great day!
