

Activity 3: Energy Walk

Note: this activity requires safe access to a neighbourhood or outdoor space. A reminder to always be mindful of your surroundings, always tell someone where you're going or walk with a parent and use your street smarts while walking around your neighbourhood.

01

Go on a “**green energy hunt**” to find how much green (renewable) energy is being used in your community. Pay attention to any power related items (electrical outlets, street lamps, power lines, etc.). Point out any green energy uses (for example, solar panels, windmills, hybrid vehicles). **Could the traditional power related items be replaced?**

Challenge: find other places where green energy could be used?

While on the walk take photos or bring a notepad to draw the green energy you see in your neighbourhood.

Extension:

Walk around your building, your house or a public building and point out exterior gaps, cracks, and damage that could allow cold air to come inside and heated air to go outside.
