Congratulations to **William Chang**, Bellevue High, who was elected to serve as the 2023-2024 **Washington State DECA President** for the upcoming school year.

Congratulations also goes to **Sidhya Ganesh**, Interlake High School, who was elected as 2023-2024 **Washington DECA Area 4 President**.

Here is their story, written by Sidhya Ganesh:

Washington DECA is an organization that caters to over 13,000 students as well as over 170 school chapters. The state is divided up into 11 'areas' which are geographic zones within which there are a series of schools. Area 4 is one of the largest and most competitive areas in Washington State, and a total of 10 schools and thousands of members fall into its jurisdiction.



The prestigious Washington DECA 'State Officer Team' is made of the Area Presidents from each area (elected at Area Conferences) in addition to the State president (elected at the State Conference). The two elections are separate, and members have the choice to run for either Area President or State President. The State

Officer team is in charge of organizing all statewide conferences, ensuring competition preparedness for all WADECA members in the form of resource distribution, and general advocacy for all members to enable their success. The State Officer team theme for this year is "Team Accelerate" and William & I look forward to enabling members to accelerate their futures and progress this coming year.

The selection process to be elected to the State Officer team is incredibly rigorous, with panel interviews, essay applications, a rigorous exam, and a campaign/speech & actual voting by members being just some components to pick the best candidate from the series of applicants.



The election of William & I to the State Officer Team is a moment of pride for us, as we are able to bring BSD into statewide leadership after a long time. William is the first State President from BSD after 8+ years, and I am the first Area 4 president from BSD after 4 years. This is also the first time in the last 8+ years that there have been 2 State Officers from the Bellevue School District!

Pacific NW College Credit is simply college credit through a consortium of colleges. The colleges that are part of this consortium and serve Bellevue School District students are Bellevue College, Cascadia, North Seattle, Shoreline, Lake Washington Institute of Technology, Renton Technical College, and Edmonds College. **This year the cost is \$50.00 for an entire year of classes, as many as you can take from the list below!** Students can earn college credit while taking classes at their high school but must maintain a "B" or better grade to qualify. All classes are on campus in Bellevue School District, not at the colleges. They are classes right here! Please check the list below and see if your son or daughter is in one of the classes currently. If so, they can earn college credit.
