Anti-Racist De-escalation Simulation (Code CARE Sim)

Practice communicating with patients and families in challenging situations before you are in the situation in real life!

Multidisciplinary team members of the de-escalation team (nursing, social work, physicians, nurse practitioners and spiritual services) will get **HANDS ON** practice communicating with patients, families and healthcare providers in crisis. Participate in scenarios (using standardized patients (actors)) that lead to uncomfortable conversations around hospital policy with our disenfranchised patient population. Sessions led by healthcare facilitators who have skill sets in simulation, CPI, and trauma informed care.
