## UCSF Health receives state funding to expand behavioral health care at Hyde Hospital

Colleagues,

I want to share the exciting news that UCSF Health, in partnership with the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH), has been awarded \$70.2 million in state funding to support the expansion of behavioral health services at Hyde Hospital.

This grant funding will support the rehabilitation of existing space to create 50 locked subacute treatment beds for individuals under mental health conservatorship, along with six additional acute psychiatric inpatient beds within Hyde's existing 24-bed Behavioral Health Unit. The new subacute unit will be operated by Crestwood Behavioral Health, which already partners with UCSF Health and DPH to operate the San Francisco Healing Center at Stanyan Hospital.

### **What this means for UCSF Health Hyde Hospital**

UCSF Health remains committed to expanding medical and surgical care at Hyde Hospital, including reactivating patient care units that have not been used in recent years and modernizing the operating room platform. The Prop 1 funding will allow us to update and expand the psychiatric unit and create new locked subacute treatment beds in inpatient areas that are not currently contemplated for acute inpatient care. This investment supports our plans to revitalize the UCSF Health Hyde campus while adding important behavioral health capacity for our community.

### **Investing in the health of our community**

This investment complements other significant work underway across UCSF Health — including construction of the Helen Diller Hospital at Parnassus Heights, the new hospital tower underway in Oakland, ongoing work to make ambulatory care more accessible and convenient across the Bay Area, and efforts to strengthen and revitalize our Community Hospitals.

I'm grateful to the many leaders and colleagues across UCSF Health and our city partners whose work helped make this partnership possible.
