Amos E. Lowe, 81, of Albany Ohio, beloved husband, father, and grandfather, died with family by his side on August 6th, 2018 at OSU Medical Center from injuries sustained in a house fire. Amos was born in Radcliff Ohio on February 27th 1937 to Flora Woodruff and was raised by his grandparents Jasper and Mae Lowe of Radcliff Ohio, where he spent most of his childhood. Amos spent his adult life working as a professional driver for Krogers and Coca Cola. In retirement he pursued his passion for building, horseshoes, and serving others. He constructed the house in which he lived for the last twenty years of his life. **He was a long time member of the Ohio Horseshoe Pitchers Association and the National Horseshoe Pitcher Association,** and won several local, regional, and national championships. In service to others, he maintained the lawn of the Wilkesville Presbyterian Church of which he was a member, as well as caring for the lawns of several friends and family members.

Amos was preceded in death by his first wife Lois Jean, brother Fats Woodruff, sisters Magnolia Eberts and Geraldine Hagen.

Amos is survived by his wife Patty Lowe. He is also survived by his five children, Rick Lowe of Chillicothe Ohio, Tammy Seymour of McArthur Ohio, Lori (Bruce) Swope of Dexter City, Joey Lowe of Lorain Ohio, and Amy Lowe of Albany Ohio; his Brother Gary (Mary) Woodruff and sister Freda Woodruff both of Jackson Ohio; his 13 grandchildren, 20 great grandchildren and an extended family including Patty Lowe's three children Steve, Jim, and Sara, along with 11 grandchildren, and one great granddaughter.
