What is ECHO®?

ECHO® is a virtual learning community offered at no cost. This all-teach, all-learn model includes a brief presentation from a subject-matter expert followed by a case study to elicit discussion and recommendations. Participants exchange information, experiences, cases, and ideas and receive feedback from other participants and the multidisciplinary hub team of content experts.

Purpose

Building upon the success of past RI MomsPRN professional education efforts, we will expand offerings to promote recommended screening tools for maternal behavioral health, screening tool resources and provide a renewed focus on respectful, culturally responsive, and linguistically appropriate care. Participants will collaborate with each other and engage in ongoing learning.
