Requirements

All students are required to complete an internship experience during their junior or senior year.

- **TIMEFRAME:** One of the following:
Fall, Spring, Summer
- **MODES:** In-person, hybrid, and remote
- **HOURS:** 8-15 hours per week, a minimum of 110 hours per semester
- Learning agreement completion (goals, expectations)

Student Responsibility

- Communicate with supervisors to determine schedule
- Professionalism in all aspects
- Completion of field experience course assignments
- Driver of their own experiences, self advocacy
- Internship poster, and fair attendance
- Observation, supportive tasks, projects, and more!

Supervisor Responsibility

- Determine the students schedule that balances the supervisors needs, and the students responsibilities.
- Review and sign the students learning agreement (goals, expectations).
- Direct students on their role, responsibilities, and expectations.
- Check in often that both parties are satisfied with the experience
- Complete a final evaluation of the student
- OPTIONAL: Meet the Coordinator to share experience, attend internship fair, be a mock interviewer, etc!
