Informed Consent

An interviewer will walk through the study procedures step by step, and answer any questions that you may have about the research.

Questionnaires

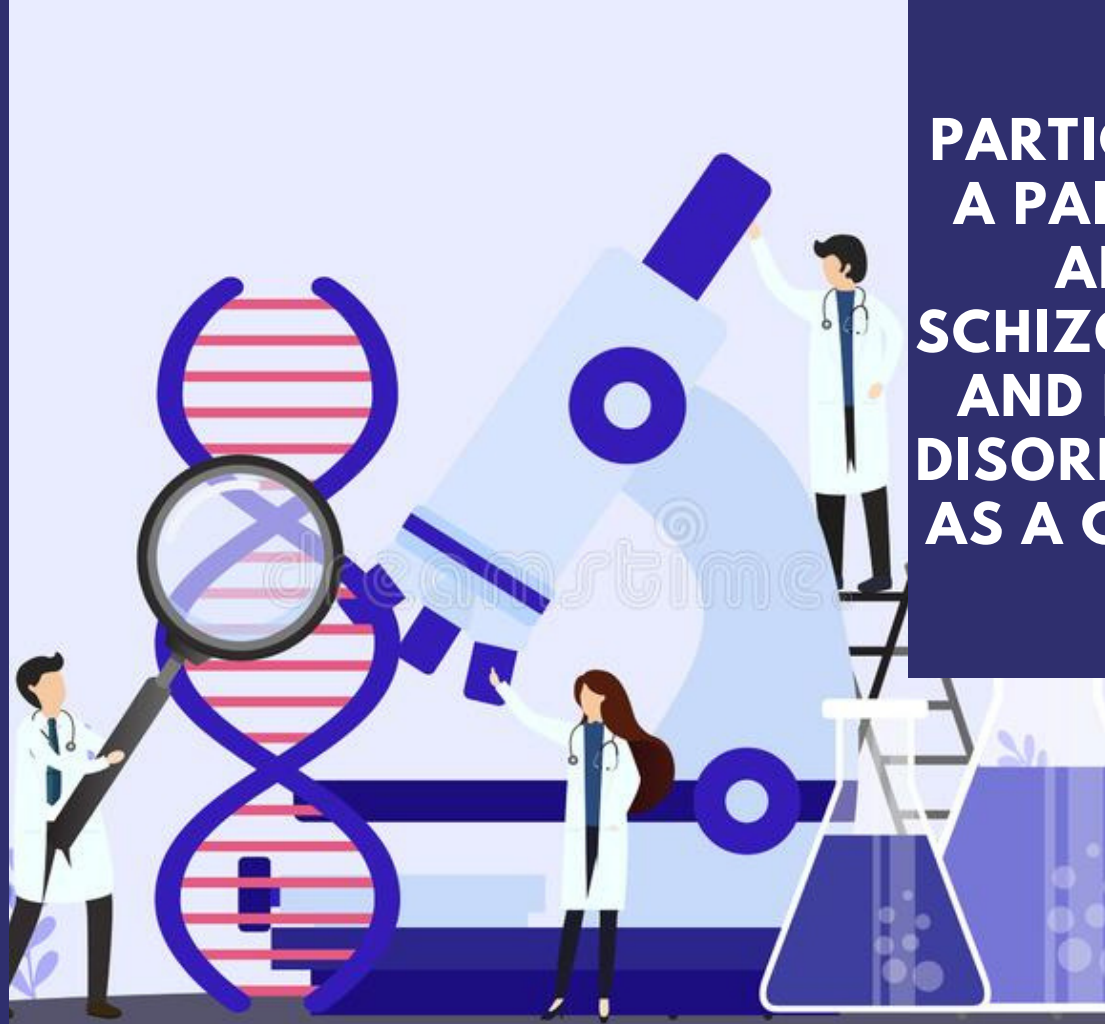
You will fill out questionnaires that ask you about your medical history, mental health symptoms, and demographic information.

Interview

All participants will go over some questions with the interviewer to gather additional information.

Give a Blood Sample

Since this is a genomic study, we will be doing a blood draw. A certified phlebotomist will draw a small sample of blood (3 Tbsp).
