Nancy A. Roberson Honored for Professional Excellence in Estate Planning, Probate and Trust Law

KETTERING, OH, MARCH 28, 2018, Nancy A. Roberson has been included in Marquis Who's Who. As in all Marquis Who's Who biographical volumes, individuals profiled are selected on the basis of current reference value. Factors such as position, noteworthy accomplishments, visibility, and prominence in a field are all taken into account during the selection process.

Ms. Roberson has more than 30 years of experience in law, and has run her own practice since 1986. Initially an individual practice, she quickly grew it into a full firm that specializes in estate planning, trust, and probate law services. Additionally, she presents the "Are You Prepared" seminar, aimed at providing information to individuals and families about how to plan for death and disability.

Ms. Roberson initially earned a BA in English from Indiana University in 1971, but became interested in law when she was suddenly widowed with a then two-year-old daughter who, now an adult, also works at the firm. Her own case inspired her to help protect others from experiencing the same hardships she endured, and she earned her JD from the University of Dayton School of Law in 1982. While working toward her degree, she served on the editorial board for the University of Dayton Law Review. In 2003, she joined an elite group of attorneys by becoming certified as a specialist in estate planning, trust, and probate law by the Ohio State Bar Association, of which she is also a member. Additionally, she is a member of the American Bar Association, the Christian Legal Society, and the National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys.

As an expert in her field, Ms. Roberson is interested in helping others to learn how to navigate the legal system. She has co-authored "Solutions," and wrote the article "You Don't Know What You Don't Know," for Living With Loss Magazine. She also uses both her personal and her professional experience as a frequent public speaker to educate the public. She has been a finalist for the Better Business Bureau's Eclipse Integrity Award in 2010 and 2017, and received the Leadership Excellence Award from the Ohio Diversity council in 2013. Additionally, Toastmaster's International awarded her the Distinguished Communication Award in 2012, and she won the Lloyd O'Hara Public Interest Law Award for her dedication and achievement. She was named one of the Ten Top Women in Dayton in 2012 by the Dayton Daily News.
