PRESENTERS

Jodi Harpstead is the Chief Executive Officer of Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota. She earned bachelor's and master's degrees in business administration at Michigan State University. She serves on the Board of Directors for Lutheran Services in America and the Association of Residential Resources in Minnesota (ARRM). Jodi and her husband, Stan, live in Arden Hills and have two grown children.

Yusuf Abdi is the Program Director of Refugee Services for Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota and provides overall leadership for the development, direction and integration of refugee services to meet the needs of refugees and the communities in which they settle. He represents Lutheran Social Service on the anti-racism taskforce and serves as an accredited representative of the Board of Immigration Appeals in Minnesota. He is a graduate of North Dakota State University and lives with his wife Fatima and their five children in Savage.

Dr. Jeff Owen is an associate professor of economics at Gustavus Adolphus College. He holds undergraduate degrees in economics and history from Gustavus and a doctorate in economics from the University of Iowa. His teaching interests are focused in microeconomics and in the related fields of economic history, environmental economics, and sports economics. He and his wife Susan live in St. Peter.

Dr. Blake Couey is an associate professor of religion at Gustavus Adolphus College, and serves as faculty associate for Research, Scholarship, & Creativity and director in Comparative Literature. He earned his B.A. from Mercer University, M. Div. and Ph.D. from Princeton Theological Seminary. He teaches in the area of **Hebrew Bible**, introduction to the Bible, and upper-level courses on prophets, women and gender in the Bible, and biblical conceptions of God.

Dr. Darrell Jodock is professor emeritus of religion and the Drell and Adeline Bernhardson Distinguished Professor in Lutheran Studies at Gustavus Adolphus College. He came to Gustavus in 1999 and taught in the areas of Lutheran studies, religion in American culture, the Holocaust, the history of Christian thought, and Jewish-Christian relations. He is a graduate of St. Olaf College and holds degrees from Luther Seminary and Yale University.
