

Parents should consider a Missed Six Notice to be one means of communication regarding their child's behavior in school. Records of these behavior notices are for in-house record-keeping purposes only and are not part of the child's permanent record, nor are they seen by prospective high schools. When a student fails to comply with one of the St. Joe Six, they are given at least one verbal warning. If the student repeats the behavior then a *Missed Six Notice* will be issued. There are also situations where the student's action is so clearly a violation that no warning is required. Students who earn three Missed Six Notices will be assigned after-school detention. Detentions are moderated by jr. high teachers and are held from 3:15 - 4:00 in one of the jr. high classrooms. Parents must pick up the students in the main foyer at 4:00. If a child is not picked up by 4:05, the child will be signed in to the Extended Day program at the parents' expense.
