

Rise Up and raise our voices in support of permanent housing for women, men, and non-binary persons.

The National Coalition for the Homeless categorizes homelessness into three types:

- Chronic homelessness are people who consider shelters as their permanent home rather than just an emergency arrangement.
- Transitional homelessness pertains to those who go to shelters for a short period of time before transitioning into a more stable home.
- Episodic homelessness are individuals who go in and out of the homeless situation due to their personal problems regarding mental health, unemployment, and substance abuse.
