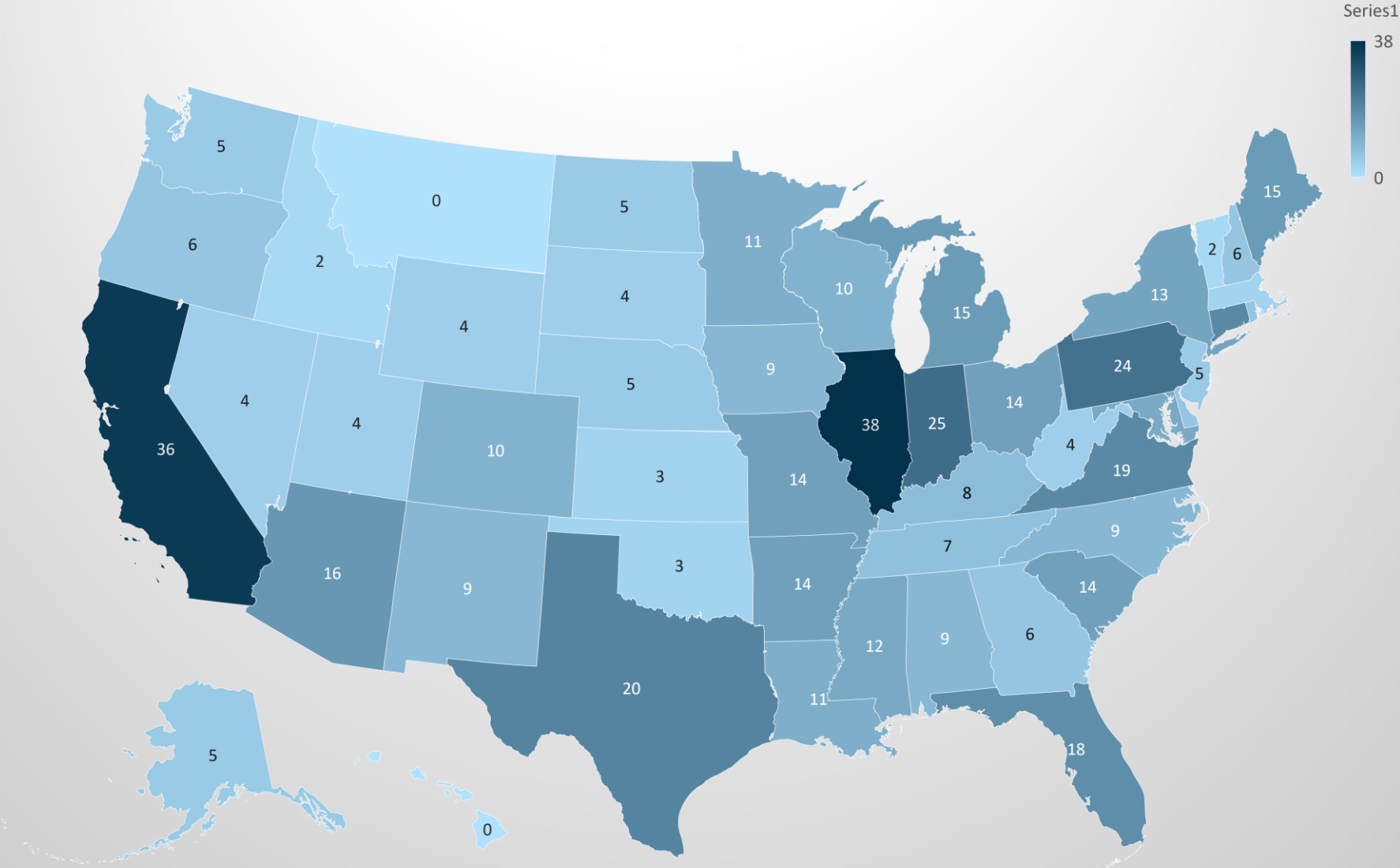
Our mission is to inspire educators so adults succeed and communities thrive.

Purpose of COABE in our MEMBER's Words

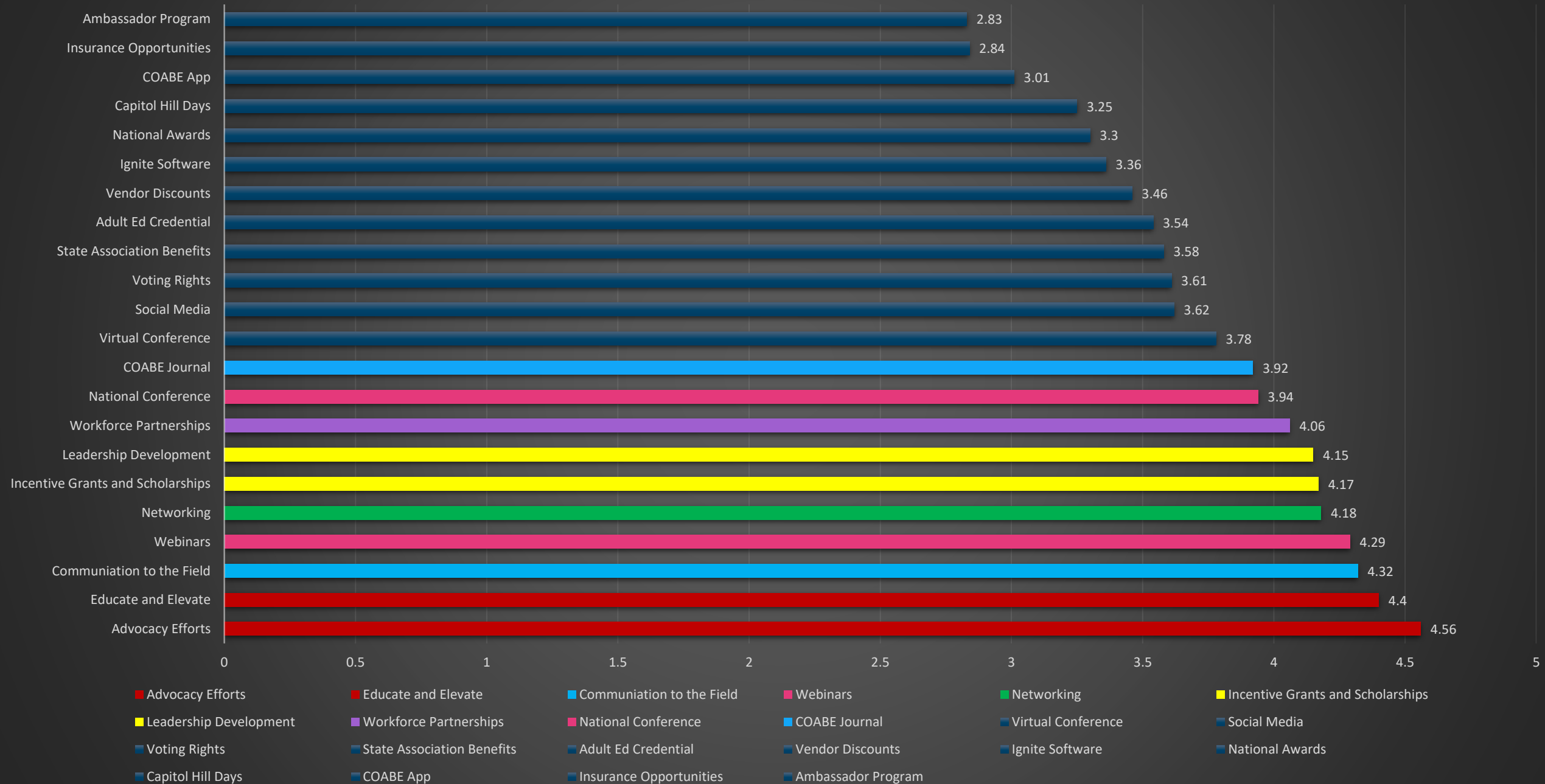

To promote adult education's interests legislatively, provide training and resources to adult education educators, disseminate best practices, and publicize the importance of adult education in changing people's lives.

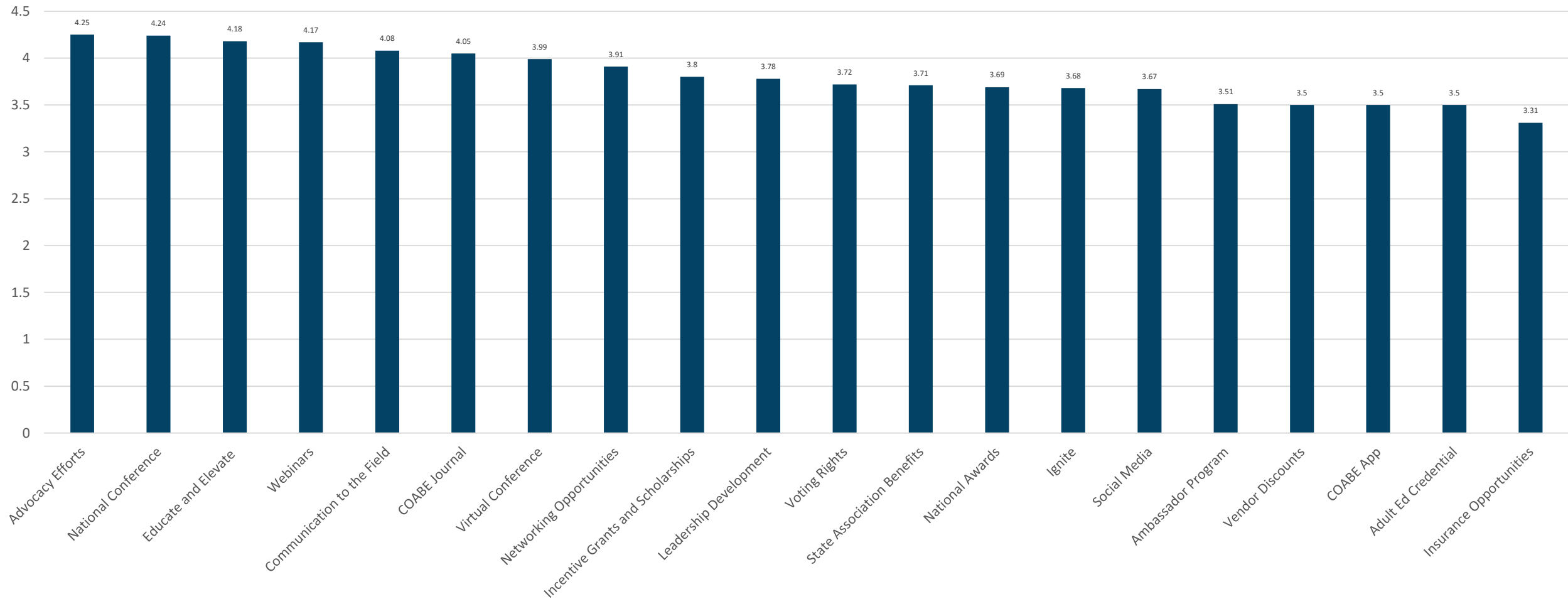
A coalition of educators and partners who focus on policy, tools, resources and development to enrich and further the delivery of adult education, with the goal of serving Adult Learners where they are.

Weaknesses in our MEMBER's Words



Need for effective communication of the breadth and scope of services provided



Need for a more focused communications plan to members



Ensure national and virtual conference remain focused on delivering high quality professional development



Ensure national initiatives and priorities are penetrating at the local level to the local providers



Difficulty for members to utilize all of the benefits due to constraints on their time



Sustainability of exponential growth needs to be supported through new funding streams



Organizational priorities need to remain in focus as new initiatives are brought on

Noteworthy Feedback

- COABE has become a strong national adult basic education leadership organization, has launched a serious advocacy effort, and yet has not significantly impacted federal or state legislation to increase support for adult literacy. The Board and staff should look at this and consider how to broaden and deepen its current efforts, for example, how its business partners might become champions for adult basic skills who meet with influential Senators and Congresspeople, and as a result make adult basic skills education one of their three top legislative priorities. Although this might sound impossible, in the 1980's and 1990's with the Project Literacy US (PLUS) campaign and significant one-on-one work with Senators and Congresspeople, there were champions, and there were significant increases in the adult basic education federal budget. I think COABE, working with other NCL partner organizations, might be able to achieve this again.
- Some states have weak professional associations, so COABE's messages don't always get acted upon or even considered, especially where adult ed is a part-time job activity.
- Improve promotion of group membership to big organizations (i.e. Arizona Department of Education ADE, Arizona Department of Corrections ADC, Arizona Workforce, Arizona@ Work, Colleges) to assure more Adult Basic Educators get the opportunity to attend conferences and webinars.
