Of patients with a psychiatric diagnosis in a study of Medi-Cal patients reported at least one medication access problem²

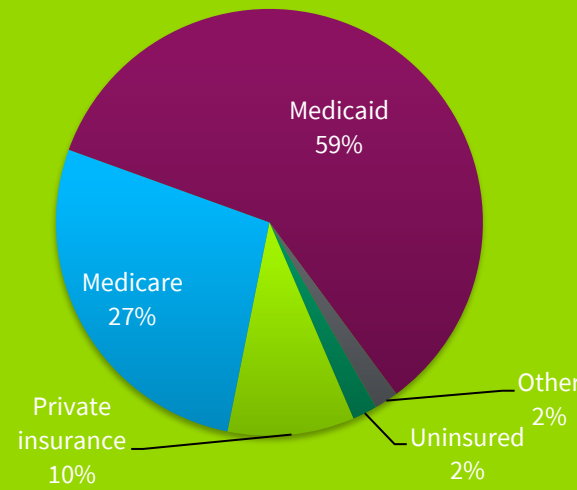
58%

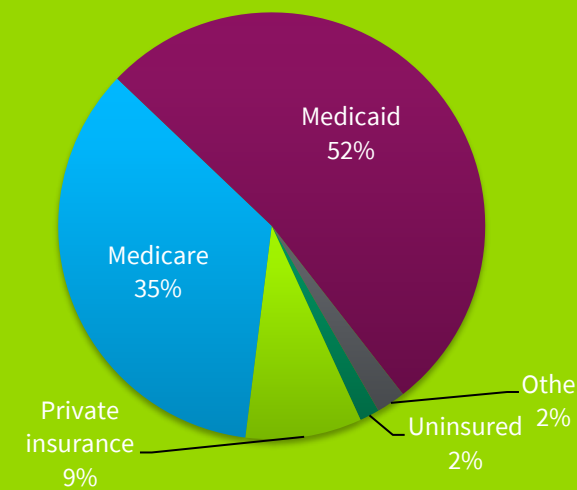
Medi-Cal Faces High Costs

In 2017, Medi-Cal covered³ 40,000+ inpatient hospital stays for patients diagnosed with Schizophrenia or Bipolar Conditions at an average charge of \$9,612 per stay for a total of **\$385 million**
