### **CAL FIRE Burn Permit Requirements lifted in the Counties of Colusa, Lake, Napa, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo**

**St Helena, CA** - With recent rainfall and cooler temperatures, effective at **8:00 AM on Friday, November 7, 2025**, the CAL FIRE Sonoma-Lake-Napa Unit (LNU) will no longer require Residential Burn Permits within State Responsibility Areas (SRAs) of the following Counties: Colusa, Lake, Napa, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo. Residents may conduct residential burning on days determined by each area's Air Quality authority.

Although we remain in declared fire season, current weather and vegetation conditions support the safe use of Residential Burning to reduce fuels and improve community wildfire resilience. CAL FIRE facilities will remain fully staffed while continuing to prioritize fuel-reduction initiatives. If adverse fire weather returns, a Burn Suspension may be issued.

#### **Burning Safety Tips and Reminders:**

- **DO NOT** burn on windy days.
- Prior to burning, you **MUST** call your Local Air Quality Authority to confirm the burn day status and any burn hour restrictions.
- Only dry, natural vegetation such as leaves, pine needles, and tree trimmings that originated on the property can be burned. Burning household garbage is not allowed.
- Piles should be no larger than 4-feet in diameter with 10-feet of clearance down to bare soil.
- Fires should never be left unattended.
- Have a water supply available, such as a charged garden hose or a 5-gallon water extinguisher.
