If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives to all men generously and without reproaching, and it will be given him. For that person must not suppose that a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways, will receive anything from the Lord. Do not be deceived, my beloved brethren. Every good endowment and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth that we should be a kind of first fruits of his creatures.
