

New DBA Area Street-Level Businesses Fact Sheet

Opened Already In 2026:

- **The Halal Guys** (241 Washington St.) [the first Downtown location](#) for the large Middle Eastern chain which started in New York City.
- **Nova restaurant** (134 Tremont St.) the new restaurant [specializes in Central Asian cuisine](#), featuring dishes from Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, and Uzbekistan.
- **Paku Katsuya restaurant** (145 Tremont St.) [the Japanese restaurant](#) specializes in [tonkatsu](#), a type of fried pork cutlet.
- **Stack & Schmear** (High Street Place) a "[sandwich-driven deli concept](#)," Stack & Schmear joined its sister restaurants, Haley Jane's and Wheelhouse, at High Street Place.
- **Tigerbaby** (High Street Place) celebrity chef Tiffani Faison's High Street Place empire expanded even further this spring with this [Southeast Asian-oriented restaurant](#).
- **Uniqlo store** (399 Washington St.) the global Japanese department store's [latest Eastern Massachusetts location](#) debuted to great fanfare this spring.
- **Cici Nails** (21 Winter St.) [the salon/spa](#), open daily, offers a variety of massage treatments.

Opening Imminently:

- **All'Antico Vinaio** (330 Washington St.) this will be just the second New England location of the [Florentine sandwich shop chain](#), with a preexisting restaurant in the Back Bay.
- **Champion Pizza** (292 Washington St.) this will be the first New England location of [the New York City-based pizza chain](#), which also operates in Florida and Texas.
- **Peach Cobbler Factory** (77 Summer St.) this will be the first location northeast of Philadelphia for [the Southern-based dessert chain](#), which was founded in Nashville.
- **The Well Coffeehouse** (78 Tremont St.) this marks the fourth Boston area location for [the faith-based coffee house](#), which debuted at 1 State St.

Opening This Summer:

- **Skechers** (481 Washington St.) this is the only Boston location for [the shoe/apparel store](#), which operates several stores in eastern Massachusetts.
- **Teso Life store** (459 Washington St.) this will be the first New England location for [the Japanese department store](#), which operates more than two dozen locations nationwide.

Later This Year:

- **Boston Funk recording studio** (19 School St.) the locally based [music studio/performance venue](#) will also host weddings and similar events.
- **The Exchange** (52 Temple Pl.) the concept from NNE Hospitality, [which operates restaurants in Portsmouth, NH](#), will open in the former Boston Chops location on Temple Place's famed Restaurant Row.
- **Haidilao Hot Pot** (2 Avery St.) this will be the New England debut for the global hot point chain, which operates more than a dozen American locations.
- **La Neta Taco Shop** (100 City Hall Plaza) this will be [La Neta's](#) second location in urban Boston.
- **Little Black Dress** (15 West St.) this will be the first location for the restaurant.
- **LuXXor/The Bloom Room** (28 Kingston St.) this will be the first location for the restaurant/flower shop.
- **Monster Ski** (151 Tremont St.) the winter apparel store is relocating from the Bulfinch Triangle.
- **Off The Rails restaurant** (25 School St.) this restaurant/music venue [replaces the former Scholars Lounge](#) and will be operated by the group behind Scholars.
- **Seven restaurant** (545 Washington St.) opening at the former French Quarter location at the Paramount Center, the restaurant will feature [a Garden of Eden-based theme](#).
- **Up & Atom Coffee** (55 Summer St.) [visit here](#) for additional info on the upcoming coffee shop.
- **Xi'an Famous Foods** (255 Washington St.) this will be the second Boston location of [the chain](#), which operates numerous locations in the New York City area.
