

A Resource Guide For Mass. Businesses During The Coronavirus Outbreak

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Gov. Charlie Baker's administration created a \$10 million **loan fund** for small businesses feeling the effects of the COVID19 coronavirus.

The U.S. Chamber **has resources available** to inform and equip businesses with the most important and up-to-date information to prevent the spread of the virus and prepare businesses for the near and long-term impact.

The U.S. Small Business Administration is also offering low-interest **federal disaster loans** and **other resources** for small businesses.

The Greg Hill Foundation has teamed up with Samuel Adams **to support those from** the Massachusetts restaurant industry who have been impacted by the COVID19 closures.

Rally for Restaurants is encouraging consumers to buy **gift cards for local restaurants** during the pandemic and they will donate \$1 to organizations supporting the community through Toast.org.

The Boston Center for the Arts has partnered with the City of Boston to create a COVID19 Artist Relief Fund **to help artists impacted by pandemic**.

The Boston Music Maker Relief Fund **provides financial relief to music makers** in the Boston area affected by lost revenue from gig cancellations resulting from public health concerns related to coronavirus.

Boston Singers' Relief Fund is offering **emergency relief for singers** with gigs cancelled due to COVID19.

Loans of up to \$20,000 are available to small businesses reeling from the coronavirus pandemic, according to the **North Central Massachusetts Development Corp.**

The COVID19 Response Fund is being set up to **provide flexible resources** to nonprofits serving those who have been affected financially by the pandemic in the Pioneer Valley.

For parents caring for children at home, the Boston Children's Museum is **offering free online resources** for parents and caregivers to use at home during this time of social distancing.
