- Check-in to the **Crowne Plaza Hotel** on **Tel Aviv's Mediterranean Coast**.

- Overnight: Crowne Plaza Hotel, Tel Aviv

Tuesday, March 26 – The Hebrew City and the Jewish State

- Walking tour of historic "**Little Tel Aviv**" – Discover the quaint **Neve Tzedek** neighborhood that gave birth to the "**first Hebrew city in 2,000 years**", once home to Zionist cultural pioneers **Eliezer Ben Yehuda**, **S. Y. Agnon** and **Rabbi Kook**.
- **ITW Touch:** Discover **City of Sand and Sea**, a mosaic fountain created by artist and writer **Nachum Gutman** portraying scenes from the history of **Jaffa** and **Tel Aviv**.
- Hear about the establishment of **Tel Aviv** at the **Founders' Monument** then stroll down **Rothschild Boulevard** to view the **Bauhaus** architecture for which central Tel Aviv was declared a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**.
- Lunch on own in **Carmel Market** – Great street food.
- Tour **Old Jaffa**, the ancient port city once known as **Zion Gate** from which **Jonah** tried to flee and where **Solomon** brought the **Cedars of Lebanon** on the way to **Jerusalem**. Today paintings and sculptures have been installed in its ancient alleys.
- **Shekhiyanu**–Welcome ceremony on top of **Tel Jaffa** overlooking modern Tel Aviv.
- Guided tour of the **Ayalon Institute** – An underground bullet factory in **Rehovot** used by Jewish forces before the founding of the State of Israel.
- Dinner on own, restaurant recommendation will be provided.
- Overnight: Crowne Plaza Hotel, Tel Aviv

Wednesday, March 27 – Renewers of Jewish Life in Ancient and Modern Times

- Depart for northern Israel.
- **Wine tasting** and lunch at the boutique **Tishbi Winery** and restaurant in **Binyamina**.
- Guided tour of the former **Atlit Illegal Immigrant Detention Camp** where the British held Holocaust refugees who tried to enter the country "illegally". Then board an "illegal immigration ship" to watch a multimedia presentation about the heroic pre-State immigration.
- Travel to the **Galilee Panhandle**.
- Ride in a "bird blind wagon" for a guided visit to **Agamon Hahuleh**, described as a "paradise for birds and people" to see thousands of migrating birds coming to roost for the night.
- Check-in to the **Hagoshrim Hotel and Nature**.
- Dinner at hotel.
- Overnight: Hagoshrim Hotel and Nature

Thursday, March 28 – Ancient and Modern Geopolitics and Israel's Finest

- Explore mystical **Tzfat**, cradle of **Kabbalah** (Jewish mysticism) in the 16th century. Visit its old synagogues and picturesque alleyways. Then discover the origins of our

- Then taste wines and liqueurs at the adjacent **Bahat Winery**.
- **Gourmet Dinner** at **Gadi Elias' Place** in **Yesod Hamaala**.
- Overnight: Hagoshrim Hotel and Nature

Friday, March 29 – Across Israel: Many Faces of the Jewish People

- Tour the ruins of **Beit Shean**, once a splendid city of the Roman Decapolis.
- Visit **Bio-Bee** on **Kibbutz Sde Eliahu**, world leaders in organic agriculture to hear how they are using very effectively biological pest control, rather than toxic pesticides to protect their crops.
- Lunch at **Kibbutz Sde Eliahu**.
- Travel south through the **Jordan Valley** and ascend to **Jerusalem**.
- **Time permitting:** Afternoon visit to the **Machane Yehuda Market**.
- Check in to the **Inbal Hotel** in **Jerusalem**.
- Free time to relax and prepare for Shabbat.

Friday/Shabbat evening options:

- Join hundreds of other Jews from around the world to **Greet the Sabbath** at the **Western Wall**. Option to pray together as a congregation at the "**Masorati Kotel**", where men and women can stand together.
- **OR:** Attend **Friday night services** at a **local Jerusalem synagogue**.
- **Festive Shabbat Dinner** at **O2@** the **Inbal Hotel** – Lone Soldiers to be invited.
- Overnight: Inbal Hotel, Jerusalem

Saturday, March 30 – And on the Seventh Day...in Jerusalem

- **Shabbat morning services** – TBD with Rabbi Buechler.
- **OR:** Sleep late and morning at leisure.
- **Shabbat Lunch** at hotel.
- Walking tour to the historic **Montefiore Windmill** to discover the first neighbourhood built outside the walls of the Old City. Then continue to nearby **Ketef Hinnom**, a First Temple period burial site where archaeologists discovered the oldest biblical text ever found.
- **Havdallah** with Rabbi Buechler.
- Free evening. Dinner on own.
- **Recommendation for the evening:** Check out the **First Station Compound** – Jerusalem's old Ottoman Train Station which has been converted into a restaurant-café area. It's a short walk from your hotel.
- Overnight: Inbal Hotel, Jerusalem

Sunday, March 31 – The Old City of Jerusalem: An Ancient Jewish Legacy

- Discover the archaeological story of the **Western Wall** and episodes of Jewish life in Jerusalem 2,000 years ago at **Robinson's Arch** and the **Southern Wall Excavations**. Hear about a new archaeological discovery connected to the Chanukah story.
- Visit the traditional prayer area of the **Western Wall**.
- Walk through the **Western Wall Tunnels** to discover underground Jerusalem.

- Lunch on own.
- Tour of the rebuilt **Jewish Quarter** in the Old City, including the **Broad Wall**, **Rooftops**, **Cardo** and **Western Wall Lookout** and hear about the remarkable discoveries under the ruins of the **Tiferet Yisrael Synagogue**, followed by free time to shop and explore on own.
- Discover how residents of the **Jewish Quarter** light Chanukah candles and 'publicize' the miracle.
- Dinner at **1868 Restaurant**.
- Overnight: Inbal Hotel, Jerusalem

Monday, April 1 – Masada and the Dead Sea: Freedom Fighters or Fanatics?

- Set out early across the **Judean Desert**.
- Walk in **Ein Gedi Nature Reserve** and enjoy the opportunity to bathe in waterfalls and hear how **David** hid there from **King Saul**.
- Ascend **Masada** by cable car to tour the ruins of Herod's palace and the last outpost of Jewish independence. **Discussion: Which decision did our ancestors make? Masada or Yavne? What does that mean?**
- Swim in the **Dead Sea**, the lowest place on earth, at a local resort. The resort also has a fresh water pool and spa facilities.
- Lunch at **Hod Dead Sea resort**.
- Return to **Jerusalem**.
- Free evening. Dinner on own.
- Overnight: Inbal Hotel, Jerusalem

Tuesday, April 2 – Holocaust, Remembrance and Continuity

- Tour of **Yad Vashem** – Israel's national Holocaust memorial and museum, including the **Historical Museum** and **Children's Memorial**.
- Lunch on own.
- Guided tour of the architecturally fascinating **Supreme Court Building** and a great opportunity to hear about Israel's legal system, which functions without a constitution.
- Guided tour of the new **Hebrew Music Museum** in downtown **Jerusalem's Nachalat Shiva** neighborhood to learn about the history of Jewish music from biblical times and through seven different regions of the Diaspora.
- Visit to the **Israel Museum** to see the **Dead Sea Scrolls** in the **Shrine of the Book** and the **Model of Jerusalem** in the first century
- **Recommendation:** Stay at the **Israel Museum** to explore additional exhibitions, such as **Modern Israeli Art**, **Synagogue Interiors** in the **Judaica Section** or the **Archaeology Wing**.

- Overnight: Inbal Hotel, Jerusalem

- Travel to **Latrun** in the **Ayalon Valley** to learn about the struggle for the **Road to Jerusalem** in the War of Independence.
