- Practice writing first and last name with correct capitalization.
- Encourage writing simple sentences using spaces and punctuation.

#### Math

- Count aloud and write numbers to 100.
- Practice simple addition and subtraction using objects or fingers.

### Fine Motor Skills

- Strengthen hands by coloring, cutting, and building (Legos, playdough).
- Practice tying shoes, buttoning, and using zippers.

## Independence

- Encourage daily routines like getting dressed and brushing teeth.
- Practice cleaning up toys and organizing personal belongings.

These small efforts make a big difference in preparing your child for First Grade. Thank you for partnering with us. We look forward to a joyful and exciting year ahead!
