AND WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?


Such a challenge in today's Gospel to minister to our neighbor which brings a whole host of reticent feelings up as there are so many "neighbors" we don't care to be around or who don't share our views or way of life. What enabled this stranger, a Samaritan, who was despised for his views & way of life by the so-called enlightened ones who knew & practiced the law but locked everybody out who didn't? The authorities of the day passed the stranger by with some probable contempt for this stranger who was not of their ilk. What was missing was the Love that gave them the law designed to bring them safely back to Him. They could not see the Creator in the face of the stranger & had lost sight of Him in their own rigid adherence to laws & avoidance of any who did not follow them.

In our own time, there is a great story bringing into sharp contrast as to who our neighbor is. It is a true story of a young preacher from PA, skinny as a rail, who was on fire for the Lord & drenched in the Holy Spirit. He was looking for MORE ways to gain souls for the Kingdom & God directed him to go to NYC. He went & he wept with great anguish at what he saw there especially among the young: the gangs, the drugs, the violence, the fear, the hatred, the despair. He started reaching out to the young in gangs in very dangerous circumstances, while his pregnant wife was back in PA...praying. His encounter with the leader of one of the gangs is chronicled in a later book called the "The Cross & The Switchblade" which touched millions of souls & the many Catholics who read it & journeyed often into NYC to hear him preach, were fired up to bring to life the Charismatic Renewal.

THEY STRIPPED & BEAT HIM & LEFT HIM HALF DEAD.

Sound familiar? That is what we are experiencing on a daily basis now. This young pastor, named David Wilkerson, waded into the very underbelly of the gang-world in NYC. He was mocked, laughed at, spit upon but never backed down to the mocking contempt of the people he had come to save. They didn't know what to make of him or what to do with him. He just kept calling after them after some ugly confrontations, "Jesus loves you! Nickie (major gang leader), Jesus loves you!" And he kept reaching out to all the warring gangs & even invited them all to a meeting in his church, gangs that would kill each other on sight. But miracle of miracles, they came & David kept telling them that Jesus loved them. And then the Spirit struck & they fell under the power of their Creator's love & never looked back. Nickie is still ministering to lost youth. The power of the Spirit enabled David to recognize the gang members as not just neighbors, but as children of God & through the power of the Holy Spirit managed to convey that truth to them. The story was so dramatic & touched so many lives & helped launch what we experience as the Charismatic Renewal as many of the early leaders attended his services in NY C caught the fire, but knew they had to bring the power & Truth of the Eucharist into the picture.

David Wilkerson died in 2011 but the legacy of reaching out to our neighbor lives on in the many souls he touched. His sermons are full of the FIRE of the Holy Spirit & are very convicting. Check them out especially "The Vision" & "Called to Anguish" in prayer. This kind of prayer could save a nation. So let us learn to pray that way. Time is short & things are crumbling all around us. Are our souls ready for the move of the Lord in our midst? Or are we comfortably settled in in the Sodom & Gomorrah of our day where our neighbor is more exploited or feared or ignored. Only the Holy Spirit can open our eyes to see them as precious fellow journeyers...yearning to get...home.
