ARE YOU ON FIRE YET?

What is this fire Jesus wishes in anguish that it is already blazing, a fire that causes division among households? There will be & there is great division even in our own families about issues that are of the greatest concern as they touch on eternal life. How many believe in Him & how many in the same household are totally indifferent to Him? How many believers' hearts are in agony over their loved ones who are so far from God & salvation? Would that the Father's love would ignite all hearts He created & they would acknowledge the redemption His Son wrought & come to Him & humble themselves before Him. Sometimes the fire comes as a cleansing fire to open us up to the fact of how much we need God. The fire is a wake up call as to how much we need a Savior to a world that is half asleep in its lethargy & indifference.

The sleepiness is ours, of those who do not want to see the full force of evil & do not want to enter into His passion. (Pope Benedict XVI)

The evil around us is palpable yet so many just don't want to acknowledge it & thus be able to confront it with the arms heaven has given us.

O my soul, created to enjoy such exquisite gifts, what are you doing? Where is your life going? How wretched is the blindness of Adam's children, if indeed we are blind to such a brilliant light & deaf to so insistent a voice. (St. John of the Cross)

The voice of Jesus in today's Gospel is totally insistent. He knows the price He will have to pay for the redemption of the Father's children & He is also painfully aware of so many not believing & not accepting or appreciating the salvation He won for them. Such painful division!

LET US PERSEVERE IN RUNNING THE RACE THAT IS BEFORE US.

Let us keep in mind that it is not a sprint but a marathon & pace ourselves accordingly frequently nourishing ourselves with the Body & Blood of Our Lord Who beckons us on through the cross & over the finish line. It matters not whether we come in first; what matters is that we press on to that finish line of faith that is our destiny.

Let us run with confidence & joy to enter into the cloud like Moses & Elijah, or like James & John. Let us be caught up like Peter to behold the divine vision & to be transfigured by that glorious transfiguration. Let us retire from the world, stand aloof from the earth, rise above the body, detach ourselves from creatures & turn to the Creator, to Whom Peter in ecstasy exclaimed: Lord, it is good for us to be here.

Since each of us possesses God in his heart & is being transformed into His divine image, we also should cry out with joy: 'It is good for us to be here', here where all things shine with divine radiance, where there is joy & gladness & exultation, where there is nothing in our hearts but peace, serenity, & stillness, where God is seen. For here, in our hearts, Christ takes up His abode together with the Father, saying as he enters: 'Today salvation has come to this house.' With Christ, our hearts receive all the wealth of his eternal blessings & there where they are stored up for us in Him, we see reflected as in a mirror both the firstfruits & the whole of the world to come. (St. Anastasius)
