
HE ADDRESSED THIS PARABLE.

In the midst of tragedy, He gives us signs of hope for He loves us too much to abandon us to the wiles of the evil one bent on capturing our souls by bringing down our means of spiritual nourishment. The attack is on families & the Church, the bedrocks of our civilization. Let us invoke Our Lady of Good Success who predicted these days & is the remedy for them.
