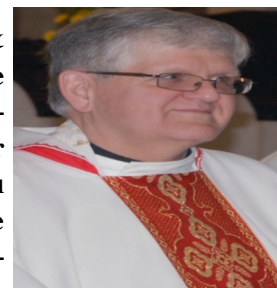

All of creation is an act of redemption to provide us with a way back to Him but we have put too much focus on this world at the cost of realizing why we are in this world. We are in a serious period of much needed correction. We need to heed & PRAY as if our real life depends on it...for it does.

**WATER, WATER EVERYWHERE BUT NOWHERE TO BE FOUND...**

...in this desert of moribund modernity. The water we seek is the water of life, the Holy Spirit, that dwells in us by Baptism & wells up in us & comes cascading down upon us when we are pursuing the MORE as we strive to worship Him in Spirit & in Truth. The Samaritan woman had a marvelous encounter with the Source of this water & when she realized Who He is despite all the cultural taboos prohibiting such an encounter, she was filled with that new water of the Spirit & couldn't contain it but had to run & tell everyone even though she had been treated as a pariah among her own people due to her sinful lifestyle. So startling was this transformation in her that villagers quickly overcame their repugnance out of curiosity as to what could have happened to this woman. The water that welled up inside her took place at an actual well, often a place of marriage in the Bible. Moses & Zipporah, Rebecca & Isaac, Jacob & Rachel, all met at wells & were espoused. The espousal theme is significant as the Creator, the God Man, has come to marry His people. He is the Bridegroom & the proposal is made at the well of new life that rises up within us when we tap into that Presence conferred at Baptism. The power of that Love Who is the Holy Spirit joins us with Him forever in His Kingdom once we give our fiat which we do joyfully as we finally come to realize Who He is & who we are in Him. When that happens, we can't wait to run out to all the world as did the woman at the well to invite all to the eternal wedding reception. Has that happened to you yet?....LET IT!

**WE GATHER TODAY TO HONOR FR. BILL...**

...& to do what he loved to do...gather more souls for the Kingdom. This year we are privileged to have candidates for Baptism at the Easter Vigil & on this third Sunday of Lent, we do the first scrutiny with them. The catechumens, those preparing for the rites of initiation into the faith, Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation, are called to the front of the assembly & hands are laid on them & they are prayed over to help them intensely scrutinize their lives that they may pray & reject every thing in their lives that is contrary to Christ. There are 3 Sundays of scrutinies, the 3rd, 4th & 5th Sundays of Lent. We, in the pews, pray in solidarity with them & support them on the road to their new life in Christ.

This was one of Fr. Bill's greatest joys...winning at least one more soul daily for God. Formation takes place in the RCIA program which is open to anyone seeking to join



the Catholic Church or to learn more about their Catholic faith. Lys Victor heads up the RCIA program here at St. A's & they meet on Thursday evenings.

The world is starving for some kind of relief from the madness, confusion & fear permeating the world & God is allowing things to happen to wake us up from the woke. He loves us too much to let us hurdle down the path of perdition. He needs us to get our minds & hearts back on the real world, not this senseless occupation with a world that is passing away as it was always meant to. We are in exile here, in enemy territory & this is a testing ground to see which kingdom we will choose...the Kingdom of God or the kingdom of the evil one whose turf this is.
