And the Lord used the story to join it with the need for constant prayer. That is especially appropriate in these menacing times of possible dissolution. As Our Lady said at Fatima that if we do not heed her simple requests about praying, especially the Rosary, there will be annihilation of nations. We are unquestionably on the brink of that as nations are poised to destroy each other. It is out of our hands but the admonition for constant prayer is our way of fighting back & hopefully mitigating of not cancelling the coming chastisement. We can plainly see the world is not responding. There are pockets of light & resistance to the insanity dominating the world stage today & we know He can do much with sincere little efforts.

The whole awakening that took place at the **Charlie Kirk Memorial** is an amazing example. When did we ever see all the big heads of our government present at a memorial service for a young man whose whole plea was to come to Jesus? It was more like the most amazing evangelizing prayer meeting that touched the hearts of the world. Millions tuned in & millions are returning to church in many places. In a religious book store here in NJ, they cannot keep up with the demand for Bibles. Young people are buying them up as fast as they can replace them. This is Revival in our midst & we need to catch it & catch it NOW before we miss it. Most of the Catholic world missed the last revival in the '90's, the only place really catching it & building on it was with Msgr. Walsh in Philly where busloads including one from here went there for over a year every 1st Sunday of the month so hungry were people for the MORE. And we attended their summer retreats even the people who had no real participation in the Charismatic movement. The quietest most private individuals from here came alive in a dramatic way, so excited were they by what the Spirit was doing. They clamored for the gifts of the Holy Spirit with a thirst they never felt here. Those of us who knew them were shocked & delighted to see our dearly loved ones who were so faithful but reticent come excitedly alive in the Spirit. We still haven't caught up to all that was poured out there. We have a new chance & one that can reach the young but the battle is fierce & needs constant prayer & action.

AND THEN THERE IS THE NOT SO GOOD NAGGING.

And our previous pastors back in 1916 railed against that.

A home should be a place where the grace of God is tabernacled for everyday purposes & where work is accomplished by song. It should not be a kennel where biting & snarling find opportunity. It should not be a stable where beasts are housed & where divorce tragically ends promises of truth & fidelity. It should not be a mere wall decorated with everything money can buy, but without the saving principles that make Nazareth an example. Now how do we find things in even Christian homes? We discover selfishness the cause of division & unless individuals merge their own devouring desires in the common good of the family, division will ever be.

There, is says a celebrated Pope, only one way to get our own rights & that is to respect the rights of others. And yet in members, kindred in faith as well as blood, there is often no thought of the other in the overpowering idea of self. It is always "I" & never "we" & as a consequence there is a faction housed, with nothing of unity save the one roof that bends over jarring voices & jarring interests. Our early pastors certainly knew how to hit the nail on the head in so many ways.

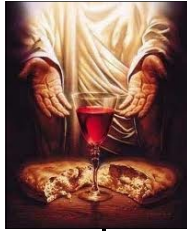
