### **VANITY OF VANITIES!**

This is the essence of hope, desperately needed as a secular world has no eternal answers & does not nurture the soul that is crying out within us. This world is a journey not a destination & just the realization of that can motivate us to press on & give us meaning & even joy for the privilege of being here knowing that we can only get there (heaven) by passing through here. Do our young people know that? Tell them.

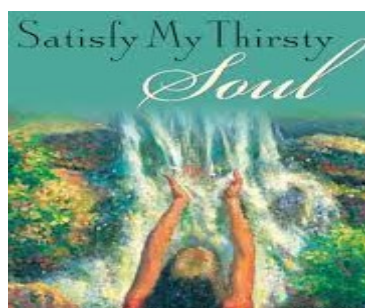

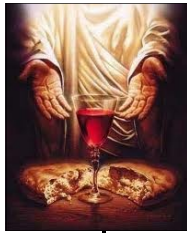
