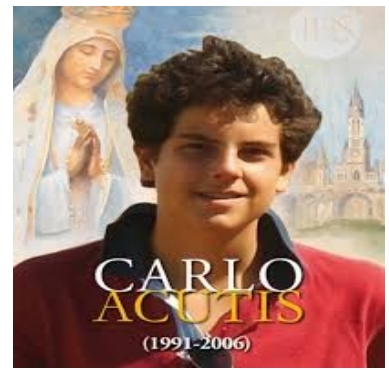

ANYONE WHO DOES NOT RENOUNCE ALL HIS POSSESSIONS.....

...CANNOT BE MY DISCIPLE.

Now that is a hard word. It is not a question of giving them all away though some saints felt compelled to do exactly that, St. Francis of Assisi for example. It is renouncing them; not being obsessed & possessed by them & the inordinate quest for more. In that case, the possessions possess us. In all the different consecrations to Jesus through Mary, there is the giving all to her. After all, all we have been given to us is from the Father & renouncing them is acknowledging that all we have including our very lives is His gift to us. Renouncing them places us in a mode of thanksgiving for all He has bestowed on us, His children, by virtue of our Baptism. St. John Paul II's Consecration to Mary excerpts:

*Mother of Mercy, teacher of hidden & silent sacrifice, to you, who come to meet us sinners, we consecrate on this day all our being & all our love. We also consecrate to you **OUR LIFE, OUR WORK, OUR JOYS & INFIRMITIES & SORROWS.** Grant peace, justice & prosperity to our people; for **WE ENTRUST TO YOUR CARE ALL THAT WE HAVE & ALL THAT WE ARE,** our Lady & Mother. We wish to be entirely yours & to walk with you along the way of complete faithfulness to Jesus Christ in His Church. Hold us always in your loving hand. Intercede with the Lord that He may instill a hunger for holiness in the whole people of God & grant abundant vocations of priests & religious, strong in the faith & zealous dispensers of God's mysteries. Protect our families that they may always be united & bless the upbringing of our children.*

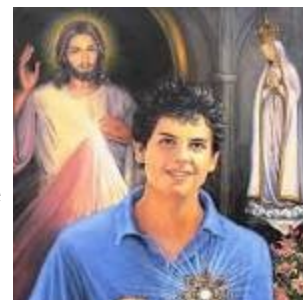

CARLO ACUTIS...

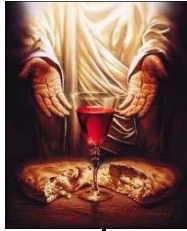
...the first millennial saint who died of leukemia at the age of 15 did not renounce all his possessions. He used them to give glory to God. The young people of today can really relate to him as he not only lived in the high tech world of today, he used it to bring glory to God. He was always drawn to the Eucharist even though his family were not church goers. For him, the Eucharist was his highway to heaven. He dropped into any nearby church to pay homage to Jesus in the Eucharist. He loved dabbling on the computer & he saw how it could be trap that took all his time so he **RENOUNCED** his desire to play games & watch endless videos. He limited himself to only so much time on-line & he stuck to it. While on it his love for the Eucharist culminated in the beautiful program he devised tracing Eucharistic miracles over the centuries. A magnificent display of his work has graced many churches including this one for several weeks where everyone could go from one miracle story to another attesting to the real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. How this is needed today!!! For the most part, Jesus rests in the tabernacles as a prisoner with hardly anyone coming to be with Him, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, Our Redeemer & Our God among us.

There are at least 2 miracles attributed to the intercession of Carlos who died in 2006. A boy from Brazil was healed of a serious pancreatic condition that precluded his ability to eat. Doctors gave him no hope of survival. He was healed after touching a picture of Carlo given by his mother who prayed for Carlo to intercede for him. A girl



was healed from a brain hemorrhage when her mother prayed at the tomb of Carlo whose body is incorrupt. Expect more!
