THE ONLY THING THAT MATTERS & HAS ALWAYS ONLY MATTERED IN GOD'S EYES is the salvation of souls. All of creation is an act of redemption to provide us with a way back to Him but we have put too much focus on this world at the cost of realizing why we are in this world. We are in a serious period of much needed correction. We need to heed & PRAY as if our real life depends on it...for it does.
