A HOLY THREESOME...

...went up the mountain to encounter another holy threesome on a wholly different plane. The earthly threesome, Peter, James & John, eventual early Church leaders, were taken up the mountain by Jesus Himself to behold something which these future leaders needed to see, did not quite fully understand, did not know how to react in the face of the supernatural & needed to file that in the untellable portion of their minds so they could meditate on it & realize the significance of it in due time...God's due time. Only then would they be able to share it with the other nine & with us through the Gospel writings over time.

The supernatural threesome, Jesus in a supernatural state & Elijah & Moses were conversing with Jesus about His upcoming passion & death. This was way beyond the earthly threesome who could only respond in earthly terms by suggesting building a shelter which neither of the supernatural threesome ever needed. Two planes collide & the event is recorded for us to cogitate on & marvel at.

We know Who Jesus really is & are acquainted with Elijah, the Prophet & Moses, the law giver, from our readings in the Bible. Remember, the earthly threesome did not have a full Bible to read. They were writing the New Testament with their association with Jesus who gradually revealed to them Who He really is. A whole series of miracles set them on the path of coming to know Who He is & this is the final revelation before His passion & death. But why?

The great reason for this great transfiguration was to remove the scandal of the cross from the hearts of His believers & to prevent the humiliation of His voluntary suffering from disturbing the faith of those who had witnessed the surpassing glory that lay concealed. (St. Leo the Great)

That monumental scene graces the upper church basking it in light pouring through the beautiful stained glass window in the balcony of our church.

CAN YOU IMAGINE?

...keeping an event of that that magnitude to yourself at any time, never mind through the passion & death that was to take place? How does one hold something like that in? Remember when Jesus healed people & told them not to tell anyone about it & we know how that worked out. This has to have been so overwhelming that they couldn't even conceive of sharing it....until it had all played out in the passion, death & resurrection of Jesus which they could not even fathom at this time.

We have the big picture. We can perceive the flow of events that eventually brought this revelation to light. How careful we must be to not take any of this for granted or treated as some fairy tale. We, too, are spiritually speechless when we come to realize over time & many experiences Who This Is we receive in Holy Communion. The earthly threesome saw Him...we consume Him! No tents need to be constructed. Our early body is His temple. Do we perceive ourselves as such? How can we cleanse it to receive the very Creator of it? As the earthly threesome grew in awareness over time, so must we by recollection, meditating on Whom we have received & using the time He dwells within us to communicate & especially LISTEN to Him. That is the very strong admonition of the Father Who tells us the same thing today...LISTEN to Him. So there must be silence & no distractions after Communion for us to be able to hear what the Father wants to impart to us. The Father makes it very clear Who This Is we have received & He commands usto listen to Him.
