IT'S THE CENTRAL DOCTRINE OF OUR FAITH.

Yet we cannot grasp it. It is pure Mystery at which we can only marvel at the transcendent awesomeness of it. The inner life of the Trinity is in constant motion & is the engine that runs all creation. The fuel is the power of love with the Father being the Lover, the Son, the beloved & the Spirit Love itself as it flows between the Father & Son in their unity as one. Mystery. Pure, powerful, beautiful Mystery. And it all happens spontaneously forever. It is pure eternal "Isness" of motion & grace & power & love.

There have been holy souls who have experienced the indwelling of the Holy Trinity, among them our own Sr. Mildred Mary Ephrem Neuzil of the Our Lady of America devotion. She was a simple nun born in Brooklyn who moved to Ohio & had mystical experiences of the Indwelling Holy Trinity. Her statue has made the rounds of many places including St. Antoninus where she remained in our sanctuary for several days during the pastorate of Fr. Bill Halbing. Most people had never heard of it before but it has grown in intensity from the *sensus fidei*, the sense of the faithful, who responded in their hearts to the supernatural nature of her experiences. Pray that this statue be given a place in the Basilica in D.C. in the national shrine of the Immaculate Conception which she herself requested. The Immaculate Conception herself desires to be given a royal place in the Basilica named for her. She who is the Patroness of America can be processed in & around it but not given a permanent place in it.

That the Holy Trinity would seek to dwell in Sr. Mildred's humble heart as it is always the humblest that draws Him is profoundly moving as is attested by the spiritual directors she was under. The key ingredient is humility. "To be plunged into humility is to be plunged into God." She had no idea other nuns did not experience this indwelling. She went about doing whatever was assigned to her while interiorly there was a profound invasion that took over her heart & soul because her humility drew the threefold God Who seeks to indwell human souls such is His love for us. She sought Him in the quietness of her time with Him & it drew Him as Mary's humility forced the hand of the Father to send the Son through the power of the Spirit.

HOW CRITICAL IS THE CONTEMPLATIVE LIFE TO DRAW THAT INDWELLING.

And we seem to be living at a time when the contemplative groups are being attacked or dismantled in many places which tells us how important they are as the devil seeks to disband them. And then on the other side, new groups are springing up to carry on the mantle of contemplative prayer which keeps the world in existence for it is in deep touch with the Creator & Maintainer of it all. So the battle rages & intensifies & we need to seek refuge in the foxholes of faith with likeminded troops.

Let us pray Sr. Mildred's prayer to the Indwelling Holy Trinity:

O my Love, my only God, Most Holy Trinity, I adore you, hidden in the depths of my soul. To You, to Your honor & glory, I dedicate my life. May every thought, word & deed of mine be an act of adoration & praise directed towards Your Divine Majesty in my heart.

O Father, Infinite Goodness, behold your child, clothed in the likeness of Your Son. Extend to me your arms that I may belong to You forever.

O Son, Divine Lord, made man, crucify me with Yourself that I may become, in union with You, a sacrifice of praise for the glory of Your Father.

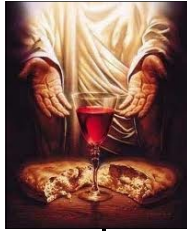
