### **THE SAINTS WE HONOR TODAY ENVY US!**

This is the time for people to become great saints, even greater than the saints who preceded us. This is the time of the great distress when our faith & our very lives will be tested & we were born for such a time as this. From our earthly perspective it certainly doesn't sound very inviting so it is hard for us to share in the perspective of the saints we celebrate today. They have a much bigger picture from the vantage point of eternity to which we are all heading. All of earthly life is a testing ground preparing us for our return to the Father from whence we came. It is a time to gain merit & favor from the Father depending on how we live out our lives according to the road map He gave us in His Word.

It is a time of great affliction & suffering which if used as He did, wins souls for heaven. We are called to follow Him and as He went to the Cross for our salvation so too must we bear the crosses in this life to gain merit in heaven & to help bring souls to the destination we were all born for. Unfortunately our focus is too earthly minded, often forgetting what we are here for. We will all enter through the door of death to eternity...somewhere & it is here & now & how we live that determines where we will spend it. We need to come to terms with death.

*We should have a daily familiarity with death, a daily desire for death. By this kind of detachment our soul must learn to free itself from the desires of the body. It must soar above earthly lusts to a place where they cannot come near. It must take on the likeness of death to avoid the punishment of death. Who will set us free from this dilemma? We have a doctor to heal us. The remedy is the grace of Christ, the dead body our own. Let us then be exiles from our body so as not to be exiles from Christ. Though we are still in the body, let us not give ourselves to the things of the body. We must not reject the natural rights of the body, but we must desire above all else the gifts of grace for it by grace we are saved. It was by the death of one man that the world was redeemed. Christ did not need to die if He did not want to. He did not look on death as something to be despised, something to be avoided & He could have found no better means to save us than by dying.*

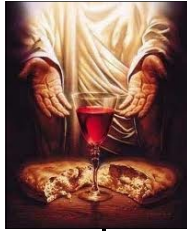
### **DEATH THEN IS NO CAUSE FOR MOURNING FOR IT IS THE CAUSE OF MAN'S SALVATION.**

*Death is not something to be avoided for the Son of Man did think it beneath His dignity, nor did He seek to escape it. Death was not part of nature; it became a part of nature. God did not decree death from the beginning; He prescribed it as a remedy. Human life was condemned because of sin to unrelenting labor & unbearable sorrow & so began to experience the burden of wretchedness. There had to be a limit to its evils. Death had to restore what life had forfeited. (St. Ambrose)*

As life seems to get less & less pleasant & more mayhem & violence & threats of war surround us, we need to move forward & look up knowing there is an escape from all the pain of this earthly journey. The greater the distress, the greater the glory will be which is why the saints of yesteryear envy us living through the great distress.

The evil one is raging with his own envy for he knows we, the faithful, will occupy the glorious realms he forfeited by his pride. The Father is raising up a new generation of young people who are ushering in revival. We need to focus forward to where we are bound & join the ranks of the happy warriors in the middle of the bedlam. The saints are marching & the souls that preceded us are cheering us on in this greatest of all battles they so desperately wanted to be in for they know it leads to even greater glory than what they had won in their time. The greater the battle, the greater the glory.
