MULTIPLY...

There are 2 episodes of multiplication of food today. One in the Old Testament from the Book of Kings when Elisha prefigured Jesus by multiplying food for a crowd with even greater leftovers than the original supply of barley loaves. Jesus went even further multiplying more food twice for multitudes of thousands with even more left overs. Even the baskets were multiplied! 12, the significant number, 12 tribes, 12 apostles. Such is His power & providence! In the second instance, He was testing & training His disciples & us over the centuries as well. There have been numerous accounts of food being multiplied & even the Eucharistic hosts being multiplied when it looked like there were not enough to satisfy everyone. Such occasions have even happened here. So great is His desire to feed His people with Himself! So many prefigurements: the manna, Bethlehem, the House of Bread, Elisha's multiplication of the barley loaves.

And then there is the greatest of all, the multiplication of His Body & Blood under the appearances of bread & wine to feed billions around the world. And of course this is what the evil one is attacking...our faith & belief in the Eucharist. We cannot allow ourselves to be affected by what other people think & do with respect to the Eucharist. It is our daily bread provided by the Creator Himself & do we dare take it for granted or even deny the truth of it for it is the medicine of immortality & when we come before the Father, will He see Jesus in us? Stay faithful. Surround yourselves with like-minded believers to stay on track.

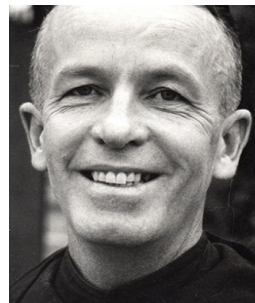
WHEN HE MULTIPLIES HE MAKES ROOM.

Did you know a NJ Franciscan brother is on the track to sainthood whose case opened in 2019? It involves Merchant Marine Captain, Leonard LaRue, who piloted a small supply ship that saw action in the Korean war. It was in 1950 a few weeks before Christmas that his ship was delivering jet fuel & military supplies to the Hungnam harbor in N. Korea. Shelling was going on all around & it was another Dunkirk situation with 100,000 troops awaiting evacuation. But what caught Capt. LaRue's eye were some 100,000 civilians on shore in the freezing cold hoping to get out before being decimated by the onslaught of approaching N. Koreans & Chinese Communists. Some Army brass boarded his little ship & asked if he could take on some refugees. So the supplies were unloaded except for the jet fuel & the refugees



streamed on board in a ship meant to carry its crew & 12 passengers. Some 14,000 people boarded & packed every level of the ship & amidst heavy fire, the ship pulled out of the harbor miraculously escaping the shelling. No food. No water. No sanitary facilities. After several days at sea 14,005 refugees landed safely. 5 babies had been born en route. This was the greatest rescue operation by a single ship in history.

Capt. LaRue quietly became a Benedictine Brother at their Abbey in Newton, NJ in 1954 & took the name Marinus where he served as porter, gardener, dish washer, & gift-shop worker. Many of the Brothers knew nothing of the heroic mission for he rarely spoke about it. As he was dying, several Korean descendants of those refugees came to join the order in Newton. Sadly the Abbey closed several years ago.
