That has become evidently clear if we wish to survive as a parish & grow during the Listening Sessions that went on last week. The stalwart few were there along with some newcomers who have discovered & appreciate the uniqueness of St. A's. But where were the rest of the people? Where are the people who were blessed & ministered to here but no longer come? Do we all realize what time we are in? That was made eminently clear in the readings for today. We are in for some very tough times.

We already see nature convulsing & erupting & flooding as if it wants to spew humanity which has caused it so much damage off of the planet. The super rich are constructing bunkers & stocking them to the hilt to protect themselves from the one thing they cannot escape...death. The wages of sin is death & there could hardly be any more sin in the world than there is now. The level & nature of the evil all around us surpasses all the evil the world has ever known. Nothing seems to be sacred & where there are pockets of sanctity & holiness & prayer & fasting, these souls will constitute the remnant that will repopulate the world. The slate will have to be wiped clean & restarted as it was in the time of Noah. Only 8 physically survived that reset. There are certainly more than 8 souls pursuing God, obeying God & serving God that will carry on human life that will usher in the age of great glory foretold in Scripture. The evil one will be chained & will no longer be able to harass & steal souls to accompany him to his abode in hell. Seems to be a lot of suffering & death about? That's because he knows his time is short & his rage at the impending humiliating demise at the foot of a woman has stoked his hatred into a raging inferno with fire from above & fire from below much like the forces of water in the flood. Each day, recite the prayers of the Rosary. With the Rosary, pray for the Pope, the bishops & priests.



The priests who venerate me will be scorned & opposed by their confreres...churches & altars sacked; the Church will be full of those who accept compromises & the demon will press many priests to leave the service of the Lord.

The demon will be especially implacable against souls consecrated to God. The thought of the loss of so many souls is the cause of my sadness. If sin increases in number & gravity, there will be no longer pardon for them.

Pray very much the prayers of the Rosary. I alone am able to save you from the calamities which approach. Those who place their confidence in me will be saved. (Our Lady to Sr. Sasagawa, Oct. 1973)

Saved from what? Not from dying in this world but the second death for all eternity.
